

This toll–free telephone number has been established as part of an effort by the Detroit archdiocese to protect children, young people, and other vulnerable people in our schools, parishes, and ministries. This line is for reporting suspected sexual misconduct or child abuse within archdiocesan institutions and ministries only. Persons with complaints not involving clergy or church personnel should refer to the archdiocesan web site at www.aod. org for contact information for civil authorities. Life Matters

On this Divine Mercy Sunday, we celebrate the outpouring of God's mercy for all us. We especially pray that those who have experienced an abortion can be reconciled and healed by God's abundant mercy. St. Faustina reminds us through her diary that to be forgiven we must trust in God's mercy.

"On the evening of the last day before my departure from Vilnius, an elderly sister revealed the condition of her soul to me. She said that she had already been suffering interiorly for several years, that it seemed to her that all her confessions had been bad, and that she had doubts as to whether the Lord Jesus had forgiven her. I asked her if she had ever told her confessor about this. She answered that she had spoken many times to her confessors and 'the confessors are always telling me to be at peace, but still I suffer very much, and nothing brings me relief, and it constantly seems to me that God has not forgiven me.' I answered, 'You should obey your confessor, Sister, and be at peace because this is certainly a temptation.'

But she entreated me with tears in her eyes to ask Jesus if He had forgiven her and whether her confessions had been good or not. I answered forcefully, 'Ask Him yourself, Sister, if you don't believe your confessors!' But she clutched my hand and did not want to let me go until I gave her an answer, and she kept asking me to pray for her and to let her know what Jesus would tell me about her. Crying bitterly, she would not let me go and said to me, 'I know that the Lord Jesus speaks to you, Sister.' Since she was clutching my hand and I could not wrench myself away, I promised I would pray for her. In the evening, during Benediction, I heard these words in my soul:

Tell her that her disbelief wounds My Heart more than the sins she committed.

When I told her this, she began to cry like a child, and great joy entered her soul (Diary, 628).

Deacon John Carlin: Parish Son Returns for 10:45 AM Mass this Sunday



"After this, Joseph of Arimathea, secretly a disciple of Jesus for fear of the Jews, asked Pilate if he could remove the body of Jesus. And Pilate permitted it. Nicodemus, the one who had first come to him at night, also came bringing a mixture of myrrh and aloes weighing about one hundred pounds. They took the body of Jesus and bound it with burial cloths along with the spices, according to the Jewish burial custom." (John 19:38-40)



Our hope is in the Resurrection and our celebration of the Resurrection continues in the Octave of Easter. Today we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday, where we pray for all souls to believe in Jesus, the Resurrection and know the love and mercy of Jesus.

On Holy Saturday morning at the Most Blessed Sacrament Cathedral **Archbishop Allen Vigneron** and **Monsignor Chuck Kosanke** celebrated a prayer service honoring those whose ministry carries out one of the corporal works of mercy, burying the dead. The **St. Joseph of Arimathea Guild** and **Funeral Directors** prayed and were recognized for their ministry to grieving families and their respect and honor of the deceased bodies as they enter into eternal life.

As a parish family we support families in grief, providing pastoral care and planning of the funeral liturgy. The funeral liturgy begins with the funeral Vigil the night before the funeral Mass. On the funeral day we gather in the St. Therese Chapel at the baptismal font where the deceased began their Christian life in baptism. We process into the church together bringing the loved one to the altar – giving them back to God. The adult servers prayerfully prepare and assist at the funeral Mass, the music minister and the **Resurrection Choir** lifts their voices participating in the celebration of life, providing comfort to family and friends. Burial follows celebration of the funeral. The **Funeral Luncheon Committee** provides a luncheon when requested and the family continues to be shown hospitality from our parish family.



Throughout this Easter Season God wants us to grow in the freedom, joy, and salvation that comes from Jesus' passion, death, and resurrection and to grow in gratitude for this great gift.


Thank you to all those who have sent Easter greetings, gifts, and prayers. My new parish assignment was named two weekends ago at our weekend Masses. The Archbishop has assigned me to be the associate pastor of St. Mary's parish and St. John's parish in Monroe, MI. I was definitely surprised by the assignment, but happy to serve! I grew up in this area and attended the regional Catholic high school that's right next to St. Mary's, St. Mary Catholic Central (SMCC). I thought I'd never be assigned near my home, but several of the top clergy leaders and some of the bishops thought this was the best fit. Right now Fr. David Burgard is the pastor of St. Mary's. Fr. Giancarlo Ghezzi is the associate pastor at St. Mary's. Some may recall him. He replaced me here for a few weeks when I went to Mexico last summer to improve my Spanish. Right now another priest is the head and main priest at St. John's. With the new assignment, Fr. David Burgard will be the pastor of both St. Mary's and St. John's and Fr. Giancarlo and I will be associate pastors to both parishes. This will be a transition for both parishes. Part of the reason they assigned me down there was to help with this transition. They thought having someone down there who knew the people would help with the transition. They thought they would see the blessing of having a hometown boy too! They thought that I also had some other gifts (thanks be to God) that could be well used there, such as helping give care and support to the Catholic schools (the three downtown Monroe parishes of St. Mary's, St. John's, and St. Michael's combine to form Monroe Catholic Elementary Schools.) Each parish hosts certain age groups for the combined grade school. I'm sure I would have some involvement as well with my alma mater, SMCC, as well. As well, there is some need for Hispanic ministry. St. Mary's has a weekly Spanish Sunday Mass and I've been told there is greater need for Hispanic ministry down in that county.

I have been blessed in so many ways here. As the Sunday announcement said as well, there will be a more formal time for good-byes later. There are still so many graces and gifts God wants to give now! My three year assignment I received from the Archbishop will end here at the end of June and I will start down in Monroe July 1. I believe this weekend we are announcing who will replace me. I was told my next assignment should be for 2-3 years. Right now the diocese is telling us to be ready to become the head priest of a parish after about 5-6 years. Shrine

has been my first assignment and these parishes down in Monroe will be my second. I am excited as well for my new assignment (and some family members and friends down there are pretty happy too!) I am blessed to serve and minister as a priest.






América Latina at Shrine






Stewardship Thoughts Second Sunday of Easter

Today's Scripture readings narrate the Apostles' actions after Christ's Resurrection. In the *Acts of the Apostles*, Peter shows compassion when he heals the sick, which results in a number of conversions to Christ. In the *Book of Revelation*, John, detained on the island of Patmos for his witness to Jesus, describes to Christ's followers his heavenly vision, encouraging them to keep the faith. 


