

- Received Masters degree from Georgetown College
- Taught History and Government for 37 years 29 years at SCHS
- Coached 3 sports at SCHS from 1977 to 2000 (girls basketball, football and baseball)
- Assistant football coach on 1977 and 1992 runner up teams
- Assistant football coach on 1987 state championship football team
- Assistant baseball coach on 1979 state championship baseball team
- Head Coach of baseball for 13 years from 1982-1995
- Winningest coach in Shelby Co. baseball history
- Led Shelby Co. to a regional championship as head baseball coach in 1982, 1986, 1989, 1991 and 1995
- Led Rockets to baseball state final game in 1989 and 1991
- Served as one of the founding members of the KY State High School Baseball Coaches Association
- Elected to the Kentucky High School Baseball Hall of Fame in 2008

Coach Bell is a native of Frankfort, KY. He has been married to Joyce Campbell Bell for 30 years (1988). He currently is still active in coaching football at Collins High School.




Charles Chiappetta

- Graduated from Shelby Co. High School in 1994
- 1993 KY High School One Meter Springboard Diving State Champion
- 1994 Broke his own school record at Lafayette Invitational with 450.6, breaking his old mark of 344 set at State Championship
- Attended University of Tennessee Knoxville to study Zoology and joined the Swimming & Diving Team
- Four-time UT Letterman & 1998-1999 Swimming & Diving Team Co-Captain
- Most Improved Diver on 1996 & 1999 University of Tennessee Diving Team
- Four-time Southeastern Conference (SEC) Scholar Athlete Academic Honor Roll
- 1999 NCAA National Championship Qualifier and Honorable Mention Academic All-American Scholar Athlete

After graduation, Chip joined ConAgra Foods in Chicago and then Black & Decker at their World Head-quarters in Towson, MD where he met his wife, Rachel Eastman Oglesby. Jaime Robinson Roby


- Graduated from SCHS in 1997

- Led the Lady Rockets to 4 Regional Titles during the 6 years she played
- Earned All-District and All-Region honors all 6 years
- Selected to the 1st Team All-State her Jr. and Sr. years
- Selected to play for the West Sr. All-Stars
- Earned a scholarship to play at Bellarmine University
- Led Bellermine in pitching wins all 4 years
- Was named the team's MVP her last 3 years of playing at Bellermine
- Made 2nd Team All-Conference in the Great Lakes Conference
- Finished 38th in the nation for ERA in Division II
- Inducted into the Kentucky Fast Pitch Softball Hall of Fame in 2009. She is the only player in the 8th region to receive this honor

- 4 Year letterman in baseball and basketball
- 3 year all district team in baseball in 75, 76, 77
- 2 year all district team in basketball in 76 and 77
- All region team in basketball in 1977
- In 1977 signed letter of intent for a full scholarship to WKU for baseball
- 4 year letterman at WKU in baseball from 1978-1981
- 3 time All OVC team
- Player of the year in the OVC in 1981
- 2 time All American NCAA Division 1 in baseball
- 1980 NCAA South Regional All Tournament team
- Holds WKU Baseball record for career homeruns, RBI's and slugging percentage
- Signed professional contract with Detroit Tigers in 1991
- First professional at bat hit a grand slam home run
- 2000 was inducted into Western Kentucky University Athletic Hall of Fame
