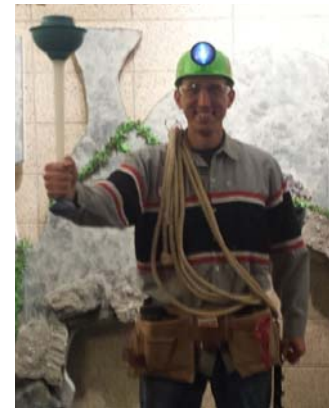

Lutheran Valley Retreat (LVR)

The theme of LVR 2016 was "Follow." We explored what it meant to truly follow Jesus and how that changes our lives. Verse from 2 Peter 1:1-9 guided our time together. We participated in daily Bible study and worship, team building elements, camp service projects, high element challenges, a sunrise hike up Cedar Mountain and numerous

other activities. The highlight of the week was Wednesday Worship atop Cedar Mountain. Sixty-eight youth and fourteen adults traveled to Lutheran Valley Retreat located in the mountains of Colorado. How do you like the new communications look? Even though we are Lutherans, we can change (sometimes)!

The new communications look is intended to provide you information in a format that is easier to digest and downright prettier! Pay attention, though, to a couple of things.

First, we have a new deadline. This is important in order for the Office Supervisor to maintain efficiency and timeliness without losing her mind or her cool. Please have all submissions into Gretchen by noon on the Tuesday before the communications come out. This is for *eNews*, *Messengers*, and bulletin announcements. Jenny, our previous (and talented) editor had a more flexible schedule and was able to design in the

evening. Not so now. So, if the next Messenger is published on August 18, the deadline is August 16 at noon.

The second big change is in the format of the *eNews*. We are still sending the *eNews* through TrinityCloud, but beginning with the August 4 edition, we are going to put any sensitive information such as financials directly in the email itself, but the bulk of the *eNews* will be accessible through a link to our new website. This allows a much improved user experience, pushes traffic to the new website, and keeps sensitive information for subscribers only. The *eNews* will always be available for viewing under the resources tab and will be updated continually.

Most of the features of the



old website are available in the new one, but we hope you find that the new site provides much more functionality and will suit the needs of the congregation more efficiently while presenting a fresh face of Trinity to the public.

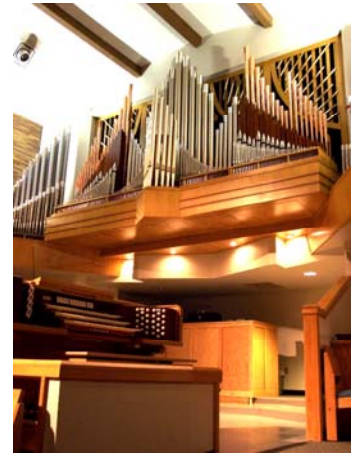

Trouble Getting the eNews? Try this!

Sometimes, members have been experiencing difficulties in receiving the *eNews* in the email inbox. There could be several different reasons for this problem. Let's go through them one by one to fix the problem.

Your email provider is blocking the email thinking it is spam. This is the most common problem and is also easily fixed in one of three ways.

Fix 1: Find where your email system

keeps spam. Look for a Trinity eNews, sent around 6:30am on Thursday mornings and add that sender to your "white list" or "safe senders list."

Fix 2: Find your "safe senders" list and add this email to the list: notifications@ccbchurch.com.

Fix 3: Add Gretchen Hollman as a contact with the email address of: notifications@ccbchurch.com.

You could have accidentally marked the email as spam. If this happens, the software resets your account so you can't receive email from the TrinityCloud system.

Fix: This is something we can easily check in the system. Just call the office and talk to Larry or Gretchen, 432-5441.

For some reason, something isn't correct in the TrinityCloud system. This could be that your email preferences are not set the way you want, that you are not in the eNews/Messenger group, or that your email address has changed or been removed.

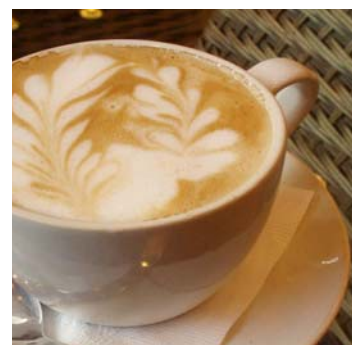
August 19 Senior Café
