What is it?

A sectionally rated stratified pairs bridge competition among District V units. Players from each unit compete in 3 sessions of bridge to win Olympic points (and silver points). The Unit that has players accumulating the most Olympic points over the 3 sessions will be award a trophy. The trophy will be passed along to the victorious Unit at the next Olympiad. The trophy at the first Olympiad was won by the Akron Unit and Olympiad II and III trophies were won by the Cleveland unit. Gold, silver and bronze medals will be awarded to the 1st, 2nd and 3rd overall winners of each session.

And if that isn't enough....

Immediately following each session of bridge, **Dick Early**, Diamond Life Master, will display hand records on an overhead projector. He will offer hand analysis and

answer any questions you may have about a particular hand you played, defended or bid.

Do I Qualify?

You must be a resident of District 5 (ACBL membership is not required, but it will be encouraged) to win Olympic points. You must play with a member of your unit in order for the Olympic points won to be credited to your unit. Players outside District V can participate but are only eligible to win silver points – no Olympic points. You must have fewer than 750 masterpoints (Life Masters included).

How Much is It Going to Cost Me?

Entry fees are \$9 per person per session. Room reservations through the Holiday Inn can be made at (216) 524-8050. Though not mandatory, advance registration is strongly recommended.

Why Would I want to Do This?

Canton Connection By John Tscholl


Playing in a team knock-out event at the Cleveland Regional, Don Little held this hand in 4th seat:

♠ 6♥ AKJ94♠ A97653♠ 4

With the opponents vulnerable and you not vulnerable, what is your bid after the auction has proceeded one spade on your left, four clubs by partner and four spades on your right?

Do you bid four NT trying to get your partner to bid a red suit? Do you bid five clubs? Do you double, or do you pass?

As you can see, the winning call is pass or double as four spades goes down three with the defense scoring a club, club ruff, two hearts, heart ruff and a diamond! To be fair, maybe your partner's four club bid on a hand that sure looks like a three club call threw you off.


