Loretan-Meier, Brigitta (Lic.Phil.Psych) - Switzerland

Brigitta Loretan-Meier is a psychologist and psychotherapist, working with adolescents, adults and couples. She maintains a private practice in Brugg and Zürich, Switzerland where she started an interdisciplinary team offering psychotherapy and specialising in internal medicine and gastroenterology. She also acts as supervisor for biodynamic psychotherapy and is a coach in different fields of stress management and prevention medicine. Brigitta uses concepts of clinical hypnotherapy in her intervention strategy. Loubser, Heleen (M.Sc.Clin.Psych) - South Africa

Heleen Loubser is a clinical psychologist in private practice in Cape Town, South Africa. She was part of a multidisciplinary team in a health medical organization and also lectured part-time at North-West University. She was trained by the founder of Trauma Releasing Excercises (TRE), Dr David Bercelli, as a TRE teacher and runs TRE groups. She was trained by the South African Society for Clinical Hypnosis in traditional hypnotherapy, Medical Hypnoanalysis, Ericksonian-, and Ego State Therapy. Tjaart van der Walt is a clinical psychologist in private practice in both George and Mossel Bay, South Africa. He is trained in Ericksonian Therapy, Ego State Therapy, EMI and NLP. His field of interest is the treatment of trauma and grief related problems. He has presented several live demonstrations on trauma and grief resolution at national and international congresses and has presented at the 3rd and 4th World Congress on Ego State Therapy held in Cape Town and Heidelberg respectively, focussing on brief therapies for trauma resolution. Tjaart is co-author of a book on trauma "Deur Trauma". Tjaart utilizes an eclectic approach in psychotherapy.

Van Wyk, Gerrit (MA.Clin.Psych) - South Africa

Gerrit is a clinical psychologist in private practice, in Cape Town, South Africa. After working in Netherlands he returned to South Africa in 1975 as head of Psychology at the Groote Schuur/Red Cross/Valkenberg Hospital complex where he was fired in 1979 for refusing to submit to a whites-only admission policy. In 1999 he started the Trauma Clinic Emergency Counselling Network, a national network of trauma practitioners. He was instrumental in the development of the Trauma Clinic Trauma Support Model of early intervention, which has received international recognition. He has also created Traumatrainingonline, where training material in the field of trauma is freely available. Gerrit has served as African affiliate on the Board of the

International Society for Traumatic Stress Studies, and he is the founder and convenor of the African Society for traumatic Stress Studies. He has served on the Board of Community Action towards a Safer Environment (CASE), and he also founded the Trauma Clinic Foundation, an NPO providing volunteer counselling services at under-resourced schools. In 1991 Gerrit received the Merit Award of the SA Society for Clinical Psychology, and in 2012 he was inducted to Stanford Who's Who. He has various local and international publications to his name.

Veldsman, Talita (M.Ed.Psych) - South Africa

Talita Veldsman is an educational psychologist in private practice in Johannesburg, South Africa. She is currently completing her Ph.D on utilizing socio-drama to develop sensory integration in adolescents. She has presented both nationally and internationally on the topic of creative expressive arts and healing. She combines her background in drama with therapeutic techniques in the counselling of her clients. Talita has received training in psychodrama and creative expressive arts therapy internationally and aims to train South African professionals to utilize these methods in their everyday practice.

Von Cziffra-Bergs, Jacqui (D.Ed Psych) - South Africa
