Using a group of 18 operators (yes...you read that right!), a total of 216 contacts were made between phone and CW with stations that stretched halfway around the world.

I also had posted a picture of us operating on the ship in the Ham Radio group on Facebook. In addition to posting the photo I ran a six minute LIVE video feed of the SSB operation which garnered some great comments and questions about QSL's, what frequencies we were operating on and several who mentioned that they had visited the ship in the past. Several contacts were made as a result of posting the event on Facebook.

Thank you everyone for your participation. Those who wanted to operate were given a chance at the mike or key and there was plenty of action to go around. Another great club function in the books!

A side note – why the NI4BK call sign? The ship's original call sign during World War II was NIBK, so the club decided to get a club sponsored FCC approved call sign for the battleship for when we operate from the radio rooms, hence the creation of NI4BK.

What year did you first get licensed as a ham

operator: 1977

What made you want to become a ham: I was interested in short wave radio for many years after being exposed to Ham Radio by my father, K2AJV (SK). I participated in the CB craze of the 70's and this was further impetus to get my ticket. I pulled two life-long friends along with me – John, WA2LWT/N2NO (recently SK) and Alan, WA2LXU who now holds my Dads old call.

Any memorable moments from your ham experience that stand out: I've had many - but I think my adventure into NYC as a teenager to take the Novice test at the FCC office on Varick St, and my first (CW) contact - I was a nervous wreck. The first Field Day I attended at age 7, which started my Ham Radio adventure (I was hooked on Ham Radio and Field Day from then on). There are also many memorable moments over the course of my 20+ years of service in RACES organizations, which include the Sept 11 WTC attack, and also winning 1st place in the 1F category of Field Day in 2017. My role in 9/11 response was insignificant, but those events are, of course, seared into my memory.

Did you have an Elmer & if so, who was it: My Dad was an Elmer, of course, though he favored the 'throw 'em in the deep end of the pool' approach, and my High School Physics teacher Bill Grahn, WB2QFZ (SK)

Your favorite modes of operation and bands: I'm not a 'mode snob', I've worked CW and Phone, but my CW skills have atrophied from lack of use. Working on getting back into operating condition on CW. I haven' t done any digital mode work mostly due to the lack of equipment and time to


dig into a new mode. I'm also interested in Satellite coms, but have yet to dive in, though I do have the gear for it.

Anything you want the club to know about YOU:

Since first being introduced to Field Day I have attended every Field Day since. Of course, since I got my ticket, I've been operating at every Field Day. That would be 51 years in attendance, and 42 years operating field day. I am proudest of my ham radio public service over the course of 20+ years – first with Essex County NJ RACES, and then as the leader of the municipal RACES Team at Parsippany Office of Emergency Management, where my team was one of the best, if not the best, and certainly most active emergency services of it's type in the State.
