In class, they worked hard and with a lot of love to create thoughtful gifts for their dad. Mrs Bell gave a demonstration on how to decorate and add fondant onto sugar cookies. The children participated in a Language Experience Approach in class, where they were shown the steps with how to make a Milo (complete with marshmallow!) then make their own, following the same order. We have been very busy in Pre Primary this term! The students have started a STEM project on deforestation. We have done some writing on the importance of forests, the definition of deforestation and the effects deforestation has on wildlife. The next stage is to come up with a solution to the problem. I can't wait to hear some of the clever ideas the students will come up with!

As part of the STEM project, students chose an animal that lives in a rainforest and they created beautiful art pieces to display in the classroom. The students followed steps on a video from 'Art Hub' and the final products the students created were incredible to say the least.

During P.E. the class have been participating in tabloid sports. On Wednesday students went down onto the oval and had fun doing hurdles, egg racing, soccer, skipping and potato sack racing!! At Hoosci the children are demonstrating enthusiasm and curiosity towards exploring science concepts. Our favourite science concepts we are currently exploring include;

Exploring forces- When our kindy children noticed there weren't enough rip sticks for all of our beyblades they decided to make their own beyblades so they could still play with their friends! Children are resourcing their own learning by exploring different materials and resources in the HOOSCI environment to make their own spinning tops and beyblades. We are experimenting to observe the effect of forces, gravity and friction as we test which "beyblades" spin the fastest, strongest and longest





Chemical Reactions- Children have been participating in science experiments to observe the effects of the chemical reaction created by mixing vinegar and baking soda. We are learning that the chemical reaction that occurs with these ingredients produces a gas called carbon diaxide. Children are making predictions, hypothesising and testing their theories as we experiment with this concept. So far we are laving the exploding baggie and balloon inflating experiments!

The children at HOOSCI absolutely lave being involved with preparing afternoon tea, baking, and sharing their ideas for our weekly menu. In small and large group discussions, children are communicating their ideas for afternoon tea options which has led to some thoughtful discussions regarding healthy options and options which are inclusive of gluten free dietary requirements.
