2015 LIBRARY GARDEN SERIES

June 17: Shade Gardening

Shade gardening can be challenging, forcing many of us to settle for old standby plants that do nothing more than cover the soil. Participants can learn how to transform those overlooked shadows into glowing features by choosing plants with colorful blooms and foliage that thrive in the shade.

July 22: Native Bee and Butterflies

We've all heard about the decline of honeybees over the last new years, but many of us don't realize that wild pollinators, such as native bees and butterflies, are declining as well. Become a part of the movement to improve the plight of our pollinators by providing a variety of pollinator-preferred plants, offering sources for water and nesting and using pesticides sparingly, or not at all.

HOW DOES YOUR GARDEN GROW?

The Beaver Library now has a seed library to help patrons start their very own gardens. They may choose up to 5 packets of seeds per family to take home and plant, using the



specific instructions on each packet. These packets must be checked out at the Circulation Desk just like a book. At the end of the growing season, the library asks that patrons replenish the seed library with commercial seeds. Because of the Pennsylvania Seed Act of 2004, the library is not permitted to dispense "Heirloom" seeds.

Patrons who do not have large yards are reminded that most plants can be grown in small areas or in containers. For more specific information concerning seeds and planting instructions, the library's large gardening section should be consulted. Patrons are encouraged to browse this section of the library in order to choose just the right books for their individual needs.



BEAVER COUNTY GENEALOGY AND HISTORY CENTER

The mission of the Genealogy and History Center is to provide an archival site for study, reference, research, and preservation of Beaver County documents and books, both historical and genealogical. The Center also provides aid and encouragement to the public for historical research and genealogical pursuits and encourages the preservation of public and private records, genealogical data, and cemetery data pertaining to Beaver County.

In 2013 the Center moved from the Carnegie Library in Beaver Falls to the Beaver Train Station. It is located in the underground bunker previously used by the 911 call center. The space is archival and windowless, and temperatures are kept cool to preserve the collection.

The Center has a large staff of well-qualified volunteer genealogists. The fees for research vary with each query. Free classes are open to the public and are held at the site at 7:00 pm. on the third Wednesday of each month. Everyone with an interest in genealogy or history is welcome.

GOVERNOR WOLF PROPOSES STATUS QUO FOR LIBRARIES

The first step in the long budget process was taken in March when Governor Tom Wolf unveiled his first budget draft, a plan for Fiscal Year 2015-16 which will begin on July 1st. For libraries, funding for library line items remains basically the same as this year. The total amount proposed for all library programs in Governor Wolf's first budget is \$60.8 million, down slightly from this year's total of \$61.1 million. Specifically, this is what the Governor proposes for library programs for next year:

- \$53,507,000 Public Library Subsidy (levelfunded)
- \$2,821,000 Library Access (down \$250,000)
- \$2,567,000 Library Services for the Visually Impaired and Disabled (level-funded)
- **\$1,938,000 Stat Library (up \$8,000)**

The Governor's plan raises spending overall by 2.7% while raising some taxes and lowering others. The Pennsylvania Library Association applauds the Governor for mentioning specifically the need for greater student access to school libraries. However, PALA is still seeking increased funding.

PALA encourages the members of the Library Community to continue their advocacy for increased library funding. Positive relationships with state senators and representatives are vitally important as this budget process is finalized.
