## MARCH 2013 ALMANAC

All times Pacific Daylight Time (PDT), which is minus seven (7) hours from UTC (Universal Time Coordinated). Location: 34.1 N, 117.7 W. All astronomical data courtesy of the United States Naval Observatory website: [www.usno.navy.mil](http://www.usno.navy.mil). Remember to "Spring Ahead!" as the clocks move ahead at 2:00 a.m. on Sunday, March 10, 2013.

**March Sky.** The March New Moon occurs on Monday, March 11, at 12:52 p.m. The March Full Moon, known as the "Full Worm Moon" occurs on March 27, 2013, rising at 7:52 p.m., after having gone full at 2:28 a.m. On March 25-28, the Moon will appear to be full four (4) nights in a row. See if you can tell the subtle changes over those four (4) evenings. Due to complicated orbital mechanics, the Moon remains exceptionally high in the sky this month.

By Jove, that's Jupiter you see in sky all night. It looks like a golden star. When you pass out on the front lawn from too much green beer, look straight up at Jupiter's near conjunction with the Moon on March 17. If you have some nice binoculars, train them on Jupiter. You will be able to discern several of Jupiter's many moons.

There is also the possibility of spectacular comet in March. It is difficult to say whether Comet PanSTARRS (C/2011 L4) will be spectacular or a bust (remember Comet Kahoutek?)

Comet PanSTARRS was first picked up in June of 2011 in an automated sky-survey conducted by the PanSTARRS (Panoramic Survey Telescope and Rapid Response System) team based at the summit of Haleakala, Maui, Hawaii. The "House of the Sun" is an ideal location for conducting optical sky surveys, because about 3/4 of the sky can be observed. The summit at Haleakala is a mere 10,023 feet, which makes for much easier working conditions than at the telescope arrays on Mauna Kea summit (13,800 feet).

As I write, in early February, Comet PanSTARRS is cruising between Saturn and Jupiter. As this comet approaches perihelion (closest point) to the Sun, it increases in speed, due to good old fashioned gravity. Comet PanSTARRS gets within .30 a.u., about 28 million of your puny Earth miles, which is inside the orbit of Mercury. It is closest to Earth on March 5, at 1.10 a.u., about 102.3 million miles. After whipping around the Sun, on March 10, the Comet heads back for the Oort Belt from which it came.

Best viewing for our area will be March 8-20, especially March 12-17. Look in the western sky about 30 minutes after Sunset. On March 12, the comet will be quite near the sliver of the young Moon at dusk. For further updates, go to [skypub.com/panstarrs](http://skypub.com/panstarrs).

**Garden Notes:** Cover Crops. March is an excellent month to plant a cover crop in your garden beds and containers. A cover crop such as Buckwheat or a combo of Peas & Oats is planted, allowed to grow to flowering stage, and then promptly tilled under. As the cover crops grow, these plants absorb nitrogen from the air and return it to the soil. When plowed under in about thirty (30) days, the resulting "green manure" releases readily available nitrogen to the next round of crops, which can be planted about two weeks later, around May 1. I use Botanical Interest seeds, available at Mt. Fuji Nursery in Upland and Armstrong Garden Centers. Please carefully follow the instructions, as you really don't want or need for your cover crops to go to seed.

**March Recipe:** Meyer Lemon Cake. Everybody loves cake! Break out your Bundt pan. A perfect cake to bring your spring holiday festivities. This works best in a Bundt pan; I suppose you could make cupcakes with this recipe, but I am not sure about the baking time for cupcakes. If you do not yet have "Microplane" grater(s), this is your reason to obtain them. There are a few sizes. I have one for zesting and one for cheese grating. Meyer lemons are the chef's lemon, as they have lemony goodness without too much acidity. If you cannot get Meyer lemons, then you can use oranges and substitute rum instead of bourbon.

### Meyer Lemon Cake

Preheat your oven to 350 f. Oil and lightly flour your Bundt pan. Pam baking spray with flour works quite well.

1 yellow cake mix (18.25 oz) Betty Crocker or Duncan Hines.  
 1 package (3.4 oz) of vanilla instant pudding mix. Do not use "sugar free", as it won't work.  
 1 stick butter, melted  
 1/4 cup of bourbon  
 4 large Eggs  
 4-6 Meyer Lemons  
 2 Tbsp. of Meyer Lemon Zest. Zest the lemons first, then juice.  
 3/4 cup of Meyer Lemon juice.

Thoroughly mix all ingredients in a bowl. Beat for 1 minute. Stop, scrape down the sides of the bowl. Increase speed to medium and mix for 2 minutes. The batter will be quite thick. Spoon into your greased/floured or Pam sprayed Bundt pan. Give the pan a light tap to get rid of any air bubbles. Bake for 45-50 minutes, until the cake starts to pull away from sides of pan. Remove from oven and place on cooling rack. Let completely cool or the cake may stick in the pan. When cooled, carefully use a butter knife and go around the edges to make sure it is not sticking to the pan. Place the cake on your cake dish or other serving plate. Then proceed to make the glaze.

Glaze and Finish.

½ stick of butter  
 ½ cup of sugar  
 1/4 cup of bourbon  
 1/4 cup of Meyer lemon juice.

Place all ingredients in sauce pan over medium heat, stirring constantly and cook for 10-15 minutes, until reduced by half. Poke holes in your cake using a wooden skewer. Slowly pour the hot glaze over the cake, down the sides, and the middle. Finish with 2 Tbsp. of Meyer lemon zest sprinkled on the cake. Allow to completely cool before slicing. This is one awesome cake for your Spring Holiday gatherings.

# THE iPad FOR LAWYERS:

## HOW TO HANDLE THE EVASIVE TIME ZONE SHIFT

I have been traveling through many different time zones lately. While out of state, one of the first and alarming things I noticed when I went to use my iPad was that all of my calendar entries had been changed to reflect the new time zone that I was in. For example, if I originally had set an 8:00 a.m. meeting on September 9 while I was still in California, that appointment was now shifted to 4:00 p.m. on my calendar if I was in London. And . . . invitations that I was receiving for appointments set by others were all being automatically adjusted to meet my new time zone.

You can only imagine the massive confusion this created and it all but rendered my normally powerful calendaring workflow ineffective . . . until I sorted out what was happening. Let me share what I discovered with you so that you can easily and confidently go about your travels without any misstep in your meeting plans.

### That Pesky Time Zone Support Option

Being as intuitive as possible, your iPad (or iPhone for that matter) likely has a default setting that has your calendar's Time Zone Support programmed to be ON. (Don't confuse this with the Time Zone Setting in the separate Date & Time section). What does this mean for you? Time Zone Support, when set to ON, automatically adjusts your iPad's internal clock and calendar settings to the location you are in at any given time - which might not be your normal home base. As I mentioned, while I was in London, for example, my iPad was automatically adjusting for an across-the-pond time difference. All of my calendar entries were then also tweaked so that everything was showing at their adjusted times and, in some cases, dates.

You can check to see if Time Zone Support is set to ON on your device by doing the following:

Go to your Settings and tap on Mail, Contacts, Calendars. From there, tap on Calendars. Then tap on Time Zone Support. To disable Time Zone Support simply switch it to OFF. You can always turn it back on.

### That Helpful Automatic Time Zone Setting

In addition to Time Zone Support, there is a separate and automatic clock setting that might be set to ON, as well. This means that your iPad might be showing a "Cupertino" time zone even though you are in Los Angeles. When Time Zone Support is set to ON, your iPad displays the correct time zone for the location of your iPad, but chooses Apple's preferred city for that purpose.

You can check your Time Zone Setting setting by doing the following:

Go to Settings and tap on the General tab. Tap Date & Time to open the Date & Time screen. From there, tap on Time Zone to open the Time Zone display.

For most travel needs, keeping your Date & Time setting on SET AUTOMATICALLY is just fine.

### The Plain English Solution

You're probably as confused at this point as I was in initially keeping Time Zone Support and Time Zone Setting configured properly. So, here's the plain and simple solution that I use when traveling now:

Set your Time Zone Support to OFF (this means that your calendar events will stay in your home time zone). Set your Time Zone Setting to SET AUTOMATICALLY (this means that your date and time will adjust to whatever time zone you are traveling in). This will let your clock shift/adjust to any new time zone and keep your calendar entries just as they were when you left your home town!

### Oh . . . One More Thing

The solution I have given you here is only practical when you don't want to include calendar entries that are dependent on the new time zone to which you have traveled. But that's an entirely different article and is a little more complicated. In the meantime, if you find yourself in that situation, you can always write me if you need some ideas.

Markets, this event grew to become the largest cruising classic car show west of the Mississippi, named "California's Best Special Event" by the California Travel and Tourism Commission.

"This was a very difficult decision for our Board of Directors to make and not one that we came to lightly," said Jim Gerstenslager, Chairman of the Board of Directors

of the San Bernardino Convention & Visitors Bureau.

"The loss of funding due to the statewide elimination of Economic Development Agencies coupled with the current financial situation of the City of San Bernardino has resulted in a total loss of the revenue needed to continue the day-to-day operations of the Convention & Visitors Bureau and by extension the Stater Bros. Route 66 Rendezvous® and the California Welcome Center."

In consultation with Jack H. Brown, Stater Bros. Chairman and Chief Executive Officer, the decision was made that, in order to preserve the quality and integrity of the Rendezvous, the best course of action was to suspend the 2013 Stater Bros. Route 66 Rendezvous®.

**NOTICE OF CLOSURE OF BARSTOW, BIG BEAR AND NEEDLES COURTS AND REASSIGNMENT OF CASES**

The Superior Court of California, County of San Bernardino, intends to close all courtrooms in the Barstow District, Big Bear District and Needles District and reassign the cases pending in those districts, effective May 6, 2013. The closures compel the Court to also reassign cases in the Victorville District, San Bernardino District and Rancho Cucamonga Districts. The Court finds it necessary to take these actions due to severe ongoing budget reductions.

Civil unlimited and limited cases, including small claims and landlord-tenant cases, family law cases, including adoptions, matters of domestic violence, guardianship matters, traffic matters and criminal cases, including felonies, misdemeanors and non-traffic infractions, are currently filed and heard in the Barstow and Needles Districts. Civil unlimited and limited cases, including small claims and landlord-tenant cases, and traffic and non-traffic infractions are currently heard in the Big Bear District. Effective May 6, 2013, the Superior Court of California, County of San Bernardino, will close all courtrooms and discontinue operations in the Barstow District, the Big Bear District and the Needles District.
