Master Gardener or the backyard



Golf Shop Re-opens - The Golf Shop re-opens April 3rd (not April 15th as previously announced here...sorry!). BBV Golf Club membership cards are now required or green fees paid when the Golf Shop is open. When the Golf Shop is closed, Honest Box payment is still required of all playing non-Golf Club members and guests (\$10 per person per day). Consider becoming a BBV Golf Club member. It's still a great bargain—only \$300/Single, \$400/Couple (residing in the same household) and \$50/Youth (under 18).

Golf Course Vandalized – Your golf course suffered some recent mischievous vandalism. Greens flags were pulled out and tossed aside, and one flag was missing altogether. Sand trap rakes were similarly abused, with one spotted in a golf course pond. Anyone who sees people engaged in inappropriate behavior on the golf course at any time, especially after dark, is encouraged to immediately call Security (371-7644).

Golf Course Ponds – It may be easier to find your golf ball that "accidentally" ends up in a golf course pond this year. The Lakes Committee is diligently pursuing a program to improve water quality in the golf course ponds and the larger BBV lakes. An integrated program to attack the problem on several fronts is planned for 2009: adding calcium chloride to tie-up phosphates that fertilize algae, continued on page 6



Reminder from office Manager

The Vacant Lot Fee of \$100 being charged to all Vacant Lot Owners is still in effect. Clarification and research on Vacant Lots is still being conducted by staff, and you should be seeing your invoice soon.



Remember EVERY time you get a new renter at your property the Office needs a copy of your Lease Agreement AND a Rental Transfer Fee that must be paid; this year it is \$300.



It's coming to the time of year where weather gets more permitting and people finally get to take their boats out. During the boating season more visitors come by way of water, and want to

use the Village Guest Dock. A few reminders when your guests come to visit you by boat:

- 1) Always reserve well ahead of time, room on the Guest Dock is limited and it is a first come first reserved basis;
- 2) Guests have up to a 72 hour stay; 3) guests may only have 3 non-consecutive stays a year; 4) if they plan on using power it is \$5 a day; and 5) they must come in by way of water, guests are NOT allowed to use the boat launch. Also, remember to check in at the Office either before your guests arrive or right after.



Remember that the Office does NOT invoice for Trailer Storage. You are responsible for coming in and paying the proper fees, supplying the Office with

current registration and insurance, and getting your decals. If you do not have decals on your boat and trailer already, be prepared to see something in the mail or on your trailer soon concerning it. The first time is a warning, the second notification is a citation of \$50 plus having to pay the proper fees (\$50 for storage and \$60 for marina usage).

We look forward to seeing you at the Office to pick up your decals. Thank you, and we hope that following this long winter comes a long and warm spring and summer. BBV Computer Club: BBCCCC




