


Clifford Schwieger Home in Minneapolis, MN (Site of First Service) October 31, 1959 16 attended Pastor Gordon Radtke of Immanuel, Mankato conducted the service.

- Berea formally organized January 3, 1960 (became member of the Church of the Lutheran Confession)
- Berea became one of the mission congregations of the CLC in 1961 (subsidy: \$60/month)

Purchased church and parsonage combination on Marshall Avenue in St. Paul for \$21,000 First Service – March 3, 1960 Dedicated – July 10, 1960











The Building Committee (Groundbreaking early 1975)



❖ As the Lord blessed Berea with numerical growth, the 130 seat "upstairs" church was being strained. Planning began for building a larger sanctuary with additional classroom and fellowship space.



❖ The sanctuary (and balcony) seating is 225 with an enlarged narthex, nursery, office, and classroom also part of the project. Thousands of volunteer hours and labor made this project affordable.





