60 BPHS Sophomores, Juniors and Seniors Inducted Into National Honor Society





Two IMS Students Earn Second Place At Science Olympiad








Peyton Brooks And Raul Toledo Receive SHASDA Award


He is now one of 1,000 students to take the National Exam with the hope of being one of the top four scorers on the Exam who will then represent the United States in the International Chemistry Olympiad.




IMS Students Showcase Chromebook Initiative at Learning Together Conference






Alyssa George Wins Jackie Robinson Poetry Contest

Franklin Fills 23 Back Packs With School Supplies For Orphans In Zimbabwe


Franklin Elementary students participated in a service project to collect school supplies and back packs for orphans in Zimbabwe.

Cody Roberts Named Memorial Principal For The Day


Second Grade students in **Mrs. Schall**'s room created Powerpoint presentations to campaign to be Memorial's Principal For The Day.

Suggestions included canceling homework, wearing pajamas to school and installing a hot tub in every classroom.


An election was held after all of the presentations and **Cody Roberts** was selected to be Memorial Principal For The Day! Congratulations, Cody!
