- Because each chapter is short (about 24 pages) and for the whole week, family members or friends at work could share one book.
- The questions and responses are in the language of deeply intense presence (pg. 39).
- Sit with his story each week and let your own story well up. Then ask the question and ponder it all week.
- Those who pray daily the Gospel Canticles will appreciate the exposes of the Canticle of Mary (pp. 61-67), the Canticle of Zechariah (pp. 85-96) and the Canticle of Simeon (pp. 128 ff.)
- Correction to page 140: Christmas Time ends not on Epiphany but on Baptism of the Lord.
