Session 1: Celebration of Africa

June 1 - June 11

Hop aboard as we set sail to Africa. In this first session we will explore ancient African kingdoms, fables, art, and food. Campers are going to explore the concepts of trade through a fun investigation and we'll even make some traditional South African food, crunches, and create mining machines.

Session 2: Antarctica: The Great Ice

June 14 - June 18

Bundle up it's going to get cold, we're headed to the bottom of the world, Antarctica. Campers will explore the lives and habitats of penguins, polar bears, and seals. We'll create our own ice core and transform the classroom into an arctic adventure with life size penguins and even design and build an igloo.

Session 3: *Discovering Asia*

June 21 - July 2

The largest continent of them all! We're going to take it back to medieval China and turn our campers into explorers. They will be tasked to build a ship to hold the most treasure and even design and build their own Great Wall. We'll discuss ancient civilizations, architecture, food, and art. Campers will then take their new knowledge and create their own renditions of our topics.

Session 4: Australia: The Land Down Under

July 6 - July 16 (Bluebonnet is closed July 5 for Independence Day.)

Welcome to Australia! We're discovering all of the wildlife this country has to offer - kangaroo, platypus and koala bears. From the deserts, mountain ranges, vast open spaces and even ocean coral reefs, campers will work together to bring their favorite terrain to life through shoebox biomes and discover animal adaptations.

Session 5: Experiencing Europe

July 19 - July 30

Europe has a wide variety of dramatic arts throughout their history. Campers will explore paintings, theatre, sculptures, and music. Campers will break into groups to write, direct, and act in their own stage production and create their own art masterpieces to hang in the Louvre museum in Paris.

Session 6: Destination North & South America

August 2 - August 12 (Bluebonnet is closed August 13 for professional development.)

Exploring our own continent is going to be a blast! Campers will learn all about famous landmarks. We will explore the architecture of various landmarks in different countries and compare. Campers will then take their turn at creating their favorite one or even their own.

The last stop on our adventure is South America. Campers are going to adventure to all the unique parks and beautiful forests South America has to offer. We will discover all the different types of plants and animals that reside there. Campers will create a Venus flytrap and a rainforest diorama.

Summer Program Tuition Agreement

(Please read and initial each item. By initialing and/or signing, I agree to be bound by these terms.)

____ Please complete and submit pages 3,4,5 and 6 of this form at the time the deposit is paid - even if the child has been previously enrolled at Bluebonnet.

____ Tuition is \$249 per week if the full amount is paid by the due date listed on page 3. If the *full* amount is not paid by the due date and the required documents not submitted by the due date, the weekly fee is \$269. Meals and field trips are included. Camp fees are charged by the week, never by the day.

____ You can receive a free extra week of camp if a complete registration packet and if all fees are submitted for 8 summer camp weeks on or before June 12. The deposit for each week is applied to the tuition and will hold your child's spot until the due date when full tuition is due.

____ I understand that funds paid to Bluebonnet School are not refundable. There will be no refunds if the camper is absent for any reason.

____ I am aware that Bluebonnet School subscribes to an Internet viewing system which electronically transmits images from its classrooms over the Internet. Bluebonnet also uses Tadpoles, communicating photos of the classroom to parents. I hereby grant permission to the school to electronically transmit the image of my child over both these systems. (You must agree or you may not enroll your child.)

____ If I inform Bluebonnet my child has allergies to certain foods or conditions, I give permission for the school to post this information about my child in a prominent position in the classroom so that all adults in the room are easily made aware of the situation.

____ I understand that Bluebonnet School provides a nutritious, delicious lunch plus morning and afternoon snacks with careful attention paid to all children's special dietary needs and allergies. I understand that food from outside the building cannot be brought into Bluebonnet to protect those children with special needs. If outside food is needed medically, a doctor's note must be presented.

____ I understand and agree that Bluebonnet School has the right to refuse service to any child on any day for any reason. Bluebonnet may refuse to allow a child to participate in field trips. Cost for field trips is included. Fees are not refundable.

____ Tuition is owed even if Bluebonnet School is closed for a holiday, bad weather, illness, or "acts of God."

____ To protect other children and for your child's comfort, your child may not attend if ill. (See health policy on page 5.)

____ Parents will be informed of departure times for field trips. I understand that if my child is not in the school 15 minutes before departure time, my child will miss the field trip. Parents are welcome to accompany us on field trips; however, campers must travel on the school bus.

____ Bluebonnet School, for liability reasons, does not allow its employees outside of working hours to babysit, teach, tutor, transport or provide services in any fashion to children enrolled at the school. Please do not ask our employees as this will threaten their jobs.

Bluebonnet Treat Other People Right Agreement

Safety is our prime concern. In Bluebonnet Summer Camp, we hope to have field trips away from on campus in our 15-passenger buses. We take many precautions; children all wear identical brightly colored t-shirts, our buses are equipped with factory-installed, three-point child-sized seat belts. A cell phone is in each bus along with emergency information about each individual child. Teachers are well-trained and all have first-aid & CPR certifications. Buses are disinfected after every trip. If a child acts out at Bluebonnet Summer Camp, Bluebonnet reserves the right to exclude a child from field trips and to disenroll. And we have these specific field trip rules for children to follow. Please discuss these with your child:

- Always stay with your counselor.
- Respect the place we are visiting.
- Listen to the counselor in charge and follow the counselor's instructions.

We strive to make Bluebonnet School an enjoyable place for every child, where they can relax, enjoy themselves and learn a lot. To help children respect the rights of others while enjoying themselves, we use the Bluebonnet Treat Other People Right Agreement. We believe that children know right from wrong in most situations and happenings in their lives. They know when they are treated with respect and when they treat others with respect. Children usually know when inappropriate behavior from others makes them feel bad, and they also know when they do or say something that hurts others.

Parents, please talk with your child about the Bluebonnet Treat Other People Right Agreement. Let them know your high expectations of their behavior toward others. Then together sign this form and return it to us. We always expect each child to treat others right, but sometimes that does not happen.

Here are the steps we will follow when things do not quite go as they should.

1. **First we will talk with the child.** If a child has not treated other people as he or she should, the counselor will discuss with the child what has happened and will help the child determine what would be a better choice of action.
2. **Next the child may be asked to take a "cooling off" time.** If the youngster continues to misbehave, the child will be asked to remove himself or herself from activities for a short cooling off period. The counselor will make a formal written note of these actions, while counseling the child further.
3. **If counseling and cooling off fail to persuade the child to treat other people right, a parent will be informed of the events.** The parent will be shown the written account and a formal incident report will be written and given to the parent.
4. **If a child further continues to mistreat other people, that child may be asked to leave the program.** Asking a child to leave our program is a very serious event and we hope this will not be a possibility. No refunds will be given.

Bluebonnet School Health Policy

It is especially important in this threat of COVID-19 that you please observe your child before coming to camp. One of the most important steps in avoiding the spread of disease is your personal observation of your own child. If your child just isn't himself or herself, check to see if any other apparent symptoms, especially fever, are present. If your child is not feeling well, he or she should not come to camp. Your child's temperature will be taken upon entry each day and possibly more times during the day. Contagious, sick children need to stay at home so that the class can stay healthier. Working together, we can keep Bluebonnet's children and their teachers free from sickness.

If your Child Becomes Ill at Bluebonnet. If this happens, you will be contacted and asked to pick up your child within one hour. If we cannot reach you, we will begin to call the persons you have listed on your emergency contact form until arrangements can be made for your child to be picked up.

When Your Child Can Return to Bluebonnet. Your child may return with a doctor's release indicating that your child is not contagious. Your child may return once he or she is free of fever (without fever-reducing drugs), diarrhea, vomiting, or other symptoms for 24 hours. If your child has a rash, we require a doctor's note saying the child is not contagious before returning. In order to keep all of our children as healthy as possible, we reserve the right to refuse the child's return if we feel that the child is too ill to participate in the program.

Reporting Illness. If your child is absent due to illness, we would appreciate you letting us know. Although you are not required to do so, this knowledge may allow us to watch for symptoms in other children and make an appropriate posting of communicable disease if needed. To protect your confidentiality, only information relating to the nature of the illness will be shared, not the child.

Medications. Medications should never be taken into the classroom. Medications to be administered by Bluebonnet must be placed by parents in the medicine cabinet or refrigerator in the front lobby where parents must sign the daily authorization form. Only prescriptions in the original container, prescribed by a physician with a the child's name, date, prescription and dosage will be administered. For over-the-counter drugs, the child's age must be listed on the container or else we need a doctor's prescription stating the proper dosage. Doctor's prescriptions are only valid for 6 mos. We follow the dosage based on the age, not weight. Bluebonnet will not administer fever-reducing drugs to mask fever symptoms. Medications are given daily at noontime.; please time your child's medication schedule accordingly.

Immunizations. All children enrolled at Bluebonnet must receive the required immunizations prior to admission. We must have a signed form stating that your child's immunizations are current and on file at the child's school, along with the school's address and telephone number. If a waiver exists, we require an explanation. If your child is on a delayed immunization schedule for any reason, we require a doctor's note in our files stating when the immunizations will be given. If an outbreak of a disease occurs, and your child is not immunized for it, we will not allow the child to attend until the outbreak ends or until the child immunized.

Outdoor Play. I understand and agree that my child will participate in outdoor activities daily, when weather permits. I understand and agree that decisions on outdoor play will be made at the discretion of the administrator and teaching staff. I understand and agree that, if my child is too ill to participate in outdoor play, he/she is too ill to attend camp.

Its standards encompass teacher education, curriculum, teaching styles, more parent communication, positive relationships, and other topics.

There are over 9000 licensed centers in Texas, but only approximately 300 are NAEYC accredited.

If parents want higher standards than the minimum standards mandated by the state and you are looking for the best experience for your child and your family, choose Bluebonnet School with its national accreditations and high standards.



Know the Facts about State Regulation of Summer Programs in Texas

Both Bluebonnet schools are licensed by Texas Health & Human Services Child Care Licensing. Child Care Licensing regulates facilities closely, inspects frequently without prior announcement and requires facilities to always be in compliance with its 233-page **Minimum Standard Rules**. Licensing inspects regularly with surprise visits to ensure that all rules are followed. **But keep in mind that these rules are only "minimum standards."**

Parents need to know which agency, if any, licenses their child's summer program. Many "summer camps" are not required to be licensed by any Texas state agency at all, leaving children in Texas at risk, with no state regulation or surprise regulatory inspections. Other programs are only licensed by the less rigorous Texas Dept. of State Health Services which has far fewer inspections and regulations than Child Care Licensing.

Parents concerned about safety of their children should prefer programs following the more comprehensive standards of the Texas Child Care Licensing.
