

I am really looking forward to the MidWinter Convention this January for several reasons but the most exciting one is the opportunity to see the Youth Chorus Contest. This new event has taken the Society by storm and given us more hope for the future than any other in recent memory. It has been the signal event that has jump started gifts to the Ambassadors of Song fundraiser by the Harmony Foundation.

It is not just the contest that is so exciting but these young men are totally into the barbershop experience. Both before and after the formal events, they can be found in the lobby of the hotel or in nooks and crannies of the meeting spaces teaching and learning the fine points of our craft amongst themselves or with experienced barbershoppers. As you might remember, the MidWinter Convention is the place where the tag singers and the purveyors of the old songs congregate for the more personal experience of four part harmony. Well, the kids have bought into it.

Ambassadors of Song is also taking off. Ev Nau of the Harmony Foundation has been blanketing the southeastern United States with chapter visits promoting this fundraiser that is the primary source of funding for the Youth Chorus Contest. He has had remarkable success and he has recruited others to help him spread the word. This year the Sunshine District has extended the free convention registration for first time contributors to the Ambassadors of Song program. The conditions are that you must pledge \$20 a month or more to AOS in exchange for two free registrations to our spring convention in Punta Gorda. The 30% donor choice option must be designated to the Sunshine District. You will receive a coupon from the Harmony Foundation to send in with your registration to exercise this benefit. Look for future announcements in the Sunburst or sign up when your chapter gets a Harmony Foundation presentation.

Sing...for life

DISTRICT BUSINESS

Happy Holidays to all Barbershoppers and friends. This is a great time of year to be with family.

Let's see now, we have a couple of things that should have been done by now in order for the chapter to remain "compliant" with the rules and regulations of the Society. The first is to ensure the names of newly elected leaders have been recorded in the Society data base. This critical step is essential for Society and District Leadership Teams so they may send information to chapter officials. Remember, if you don't have correct personal data on file (i.e. E-mail address), important society information can not be forwarded to you.

And reporting your 2012 elected officers is easy for chapter secretaries to do! Just: Log into Members Only. Once entered into the system select My Memberships, then My Chapters, then Chapter Leaders, then on the pull down menu, select Future. In this screen, you can add names for related positions. At each office, select the appropriate Chapter Member and his Role or office. Insert the Start and End date, lastly select Add Leader. The names are reported to Society and displayed under Chapter Officers on the Members Only page. As of this writing, all but six chapters have entered the new chapter officers in ebiz.

While you're at it, you might as well check your individual records in the data base to make sure your data is correct too!!

Did you know your chapter's 2012 Not-For-Profit (NFP) Corporation annual report must be reported to the State of Florida between January 1 and May 1? So, get it in on time. Go to http://sunbiz.org/. If a chapter secretary or other officer who was acting as the Corporate Agent, no longer holds the chapter job, then it is important that the forms be processed with the new agent named. The form may be submitted on the Florida Department of State, Division of Corporations website, sunbiz.org.

Failure to submit the annual report by the deadline will result in the loss of Not-For-Profit Corporation Status and in the administrative dissolution of your corporation and you will no longer be recognized as an active chapter within the Barbershop Harmony Society.

A chapter that is not incorporated is not techni-

cally in compliance with the Society Bylaws, Statements of Policy, rules and regulations, and is not eligible to compete, have a vote in the House of Delegates meeting, register quartets as part of its chapter (which will affect their ability to compete also) or be covered under any of the Society's liability insurance coverage, and subjects the chapter president and officers to personal liability. Wow, what incentive to take care of your NFP annual reports ASAP.

Here's another reminder. If your chapter held a show or shows in 2011 and your total annual gross show revenue was \$48,666 or less the chapter owes \$222.00 in ASCAP fees for the year. Information regarding the ASCAP fees is found on pages 30 to 32 of the Chapter Secretary Manual. This fee needs to be submitted by the end of the calendar year.

Is your chapter thinking of changing the CHORUS name? Great, have at it but remember to do it the right way. If the chorus agrees, the chapter president or secretary can change the CHORUS name under EDIT CHAPTER at the top of the chapter ebiz page (chapter roster list). The chapter does not need the permission of the district nor the Society HQ to do this. However, chapters MAY NOT change the chapter name without both District and Society approval. Contact me if you are contemplating this.

All chapter shows that have been approved and cleared by the district are entered on the district calendar found on the District web page. If your show is not listed, contact me. Thanks

Online Convention Registration

Sunshine District Online Convention Registration

While many of you have been successfully registering for Conventions online, there are still a few of you that are having trouble. The goal of this article is to help you learn how our online Convention Registration system works and hopefully provide answers to some frequently asked questions.

To begin the process, just go to our website: http://www.sunshinedistrict.org You'll start by clicking the big blue button that says "Convention Registration" on the right side of the page. This leads you to the Sunshine District Store. The next thing to look for is under "Categories" on the left side of the page. Click on "District Conventions." This takes you to the page where you can make your badge/ticket selections. The options available are listed in the middle of the page. All competitors and most other attendees will need an All-Events Registration, so we'll start there.

For these registrations, there are three choices: All-Events, Student All-Events, and 50 Year All-Events. They're pretty self-explanatory and most of us fall under regular registration. To confirm, "Student" is defined as anyone 25 years of age or younger, and "50 Year" is defined as having been a Society member for at least 50 years. No matter which one you choose, the process is the same – and you can only create one badge (registration) at a time. Click on the "All-Events Registration" link that applies to you to continue.

On this page, there are several text boxes for you to input your information: Badge Name, Chapter Name, Chorus Name, and Quartet Name. There are also some check boxes for you to add your voice part or VIP information. Once you've filled in the appropriate fields, click the button that says "Add To continued on page 6

Cart" which takes you to another page listing all items you are purchasing. If you need another registration, competitor recording, or single event spectator ticket, click the button that says "Continue Shopping" which will take you back to the same product page where you entered your information. If you need a second All-Events badge, just fill in the info as before. If you need a different class of badge, or a recording, or a spectator ticket, click on "District Conventions" under Categories on the left to return to the full product listing.

If you add something to your cart unintentionally, or if there's anything that shouldn't be there, or if you accidentally added a second identical badge, you can click the trash can image to the right of each item to delete it. Once you have everything you need, click the button that says "Checkout" which takes you to the "Sign In" page. If you already have an account, you can sign in with your email address and password. If you don't remember it, you can click the phrase "Forgot your password?" to have it emailed to you. If you're purchasing for the first time, you'll need to create an account by filling all the required fields.

All credit card transactions are securely processed through PayPal. You are not required to sign up for an account, but it is recommended. If you prefer, you can check out as a "guest" through PayPal, but you will still need to enter all your information.

That's about it. If you have any trouble, or questions that aren't answered here, please contact me via email and I'd be happy to assist however I can.

Youth Harmony Festival

The Youth Harmony Festival

On October 3, 2011 one of the largest Youth Festivals in the Sunshine District was held in Santa Rosa County, (Northwest Florida). This little-heralded event was the culmination of months of planning by Carlton Cox, the Festival Coordinator and a member of the Emerald Coast Chorus (Fort Walton Beach Chapter). The Festival has been held annually for about 12 years and was started by local Pensacola Barbershop legends, the late Jeb Stuart and Jack Champlin. This year the Festival was held at the Coastline Calvary Chapel in Gulf Breeze, FL.

Carlton spent over 60 hours of actual planning (including 16 hours in meetings) and drove over 200 miles to coordinate with teachers in eight schools. The end result was over 280 men, women, young ladies and young men there for the express purpose of learning and sharing good music in the Barbershop style. The numbers included approximately 250 students, 9 teachers, 16 Barbershop members (13 from the Emerald Coast Chorus and 3 from the Fiesta Chorus Pensacola)), 1 clinician (Alex Rubin, Sunshine District 2010 Barbershopper of the Year and Director of the HD Youth Chorus of the Sunshine District,) and 1 teaching quartet (iQuartet).

Most amazing was the support provided by all: the Harmony Foundation provided financial support for music, student lunches, and travel expenses; the Sunshine District also provided financial support and helped to arrange for the clinician and iQuartet; the schools supported the concept of the Festival and provided buses, bus drivers and authorization of this field trip for the students and their teachers; Calvary Chapel made their excellent facilities available; Alex Rubin and iQuartet willingly gave their very valuable time; and the attending Barbershop members helped coordinate events during the day.

Music was sent to the teachers early in the school year for rehearsal to prepare for the workshop. When the students arrived, they were divided by gender and then into their four singing parts. Each part went to separate rooms with a coach, Director, or teacher to learn how to sing together and how to create unit sound. iQuartet members (Jose Contreras-Lead, Andrew Lujan-Tenor, Christian Diaz-Bass, Kevin Mendez-Baritone) and Alex Rubin coached the young men, while the Santa Rosa County Music Educators and one Okaloosa County Music Educator did the same for the young women. After lunch, there was another short rehearsal with all the young men singing together and all the young women singing together. In the afternoon. Alex emceed and directed a show so the students could show off their singing skills.

The girls sang a set "Love Me Tender" and "Rock Around the Clock", then the boys sang their set "I

Believe in Music" and "In the Still of The Night", and finally the combined boys and girls chorus sang "Harmony". It was truly an experience to see and hear all those young men and women on stage singing. Between sets, Alex told the audience, "This is tremendous. This has been one of the largest Youth Festivals I've attended. Kudos to the teachers for taking on the burden and teaching these



kids." iQuartet (7th place collegiate quartet at the International Convention this year) entertained the students with a couple of songs at the conclusion of the show. Many parents were able to attend the event to see their kids on stage in a huge chorus. One young lady told me, "This is great, I've really enjoyed it." When I asked her how long she has been singing, she responded, "Eight years, I just love to sing." What a finale to a day filled with music, iust to know we are helping to bring young

students together to the sound of four-part harmony!

SOCIETY BOARD MEETING Hilton DFW Lakes Conference Center Grapevine, TX November 3-6, 2011

Gentlemen, I bring you greetings from the Society President, Alan Lamson, and our Interim Executive Director, Larry Deters. It was a pleasure visiting with several of your Sunshine Board members in Dallas this past weekend at the mini-Leadership Forum. The school was well attended and spirits were high. Hopefully, the energy and enthusiasm from many of the meetings will be felt throughout your district in the coming months as Operation Harold Hill comes marching into town once again!

The Society Board voted to change the time and venue for the 2011 Fall SBOD meeting from Nashville to Dallas, TX. This was primarily due to the fact that a mini-Leadership Forum was already booked for the same weekend. The SBOD saw this as an opportunity to mingle among the DP's and the other district board officers during the weekend and to gauge the impact of the forum on the attendees.

The SBOD meeting convened on Thursday morning and was adjourned around 10 pm on Friday. The meeting agenda was planned around three training sessions for the Board that were most educational, interesting, and enjoyable. Society Treasurer, Dwayne Cooper, provided a probing insight into financial issues for nonprofit governance boards. Then, board member John Miller of NBC fame astounded the Board with his knowledge of branding, advertising and utilizing social media to open up a whole new world of opportunities for promoting and helping expand the world's understanding of who the BHS is and what our impact could potentially become. Our third educational segment was a question and answer period with Jim Clancy, director of the world renowned Dallas Vocal Majority, on Friday afternoon. Several members of the Board had an opportunity on Thursday evening to attend the VM rehearsal, some of us for the first time ever. Needless to say, we were treated like family at the rehearsal and greeted warmly by the chapter. We were serenaded all evening long and even had the opportunity to join the VM on the risers to sing one of Clancy's newest arrangements. The Q&A

session with Jim Clancy, along with assistance from Board member and VM singer Gary Parker, was an inside look into the beginnings and growth of the VM and how the music team and board of directors worked together to produce a world class organization within the BHS.

Saturday was dedicated to having the SBOD intermingle in the Leadership Forum classes and participate in the discussions. President Alan Lamson and Exec VP Shannon Elswick both had opportunities to address the DP's and President Lamson made a point to address the other classes as well. It was an informative day with opportunities galore to sit with some of our liaison chapter board members and to become more acquainted with many of our district leaders. I thoroughly enjoyed my talks with John Spang, Nick Schwob, Bart Van de Mark, and Harold Nance. Sunshine is very blessed to have men of this caliber and dedication serving on its District BOD! The weekend was such a success that the SBOD is looking into joining the full Leadership Forum again next fall in Dallas.

I am excited about the prospects of Sunshine District utilizing the Operation Harold Hill program to grow its membership. There was much emphasis on the program at the Forum and everyone seemed very high on the potential this revived program could have on membership throughout our Society! A goal of 3200 new members is now in place.

Here are the highlights of the Society Board Meeting held just prior to the Leadership Forum:

- The financial reports from CFO Heather Verble and Society Treasurer Dwayne Cooper found the Society finances to be in good shape, especially during these dire economic times. Heather was able to get an excellent refinance agreement in place with Sun Trust Bank for ten years with a fixed rate at 4.87%. Heather and Dwayne are continuing to work together with the Board of Trustees and the Harmony Foundation treasurer and CEO to bring the two financial programs more in line to help simplify the reporting processes and to more easily keep track of cash flow between the BHS and HFI.
- 2) The CEO report from Interim Executive Director Larry Deters indicated that registrations for both Tucson and Portland were lagging behind the comparable time frames for Las Vegas and Kansas City registrations, but it is still too early to tell. There will continued on page 17

Contest & Judging

Contest & Judging By Harold Lathom

I received many positive comments from our competitors regarding the quality of the Evaluation Sessions at our contest this last fall in Orlando. Not only were they receiving a review of their performance(s) but were given tips on how they can improve for future contests. The judging panel reported that they were very pleased on the positive attitude of the competitors in the Evaluation Sessions.

It was great to have so many quality quartets and choruses in our contests. CHANGES TO OUR The district leadership is very pleased that we are seeing more and more quartets, but yet disappointed that we don't see more choruses. It has been several years since we have seen more than 10 choruses in our chorus competition. We encour-

age choruses who have not competed recently to enter our future contests.

Two important changes to our contests have been approved by the Sunshine District Board of Directors, effective with our 2012 Spring Contest.

1. The cutoff for contest entry has been moved from two weeks prior to the contest to Four Weeks prior to the contest. Since the convention team needs to have contestant information to prepare for the OA draw, contestant flow schedules and communication to contestants, it was felt that moving the entry cutoff to Four Weeks would give all involved sufficient time to make sure that there were no glitches.

Any entries received beyond the new cutoff date will be taken in consideration but not guaranteed. To be considered for late entry, the reason must be documented and submitted to me with a final decision being made by members of the convention team.

2. We are no longer going to have chorus plateau designations, thus there will be no plateau winners recognized as in the past. After almost two years of study/discussion by

a committee, it was felt that our current plateau system was "broken" and needed to be fixed.

We will continue to have a Most Improved Chorus award, however the calculation will be based upon Raw Score improvement. In the past we have used a mathematical formula built into BBSCORES (the program used by the Contest Administra-THERE ARE TWO tors). The raw score will compare Spring/ Spring or Fall/Fall scores. The most recent Spring/Fall score will be used. For choruses that have skipped a year (or PORTED IN THIS more) we will go as far back as necessary to obtain a score to be used for comparison.

> The committee who proposed our changes felt that we should be rewarding improvement, not that a chorus happened to be the highest scoring of a group of choruses. We will be recognizing/awarding those choruses who have shown improvement from their last Spring/Fall Contest. We are establishing a Grade Level for posting scoring and if a chorus improves a Grade Level they will be recognized. We possibly can have multiple awards, yet there may be no awards. Sunshine District Regional Academies

We are in the process of executing our Regional Leadership Training concept and the following are some of the numbers that we have experienced. Of the twenty chapters that were scheduled to attend, eighteen have sent officers for training. The total students to date are seventy-nine.

The academies have been located in Ft. Walton Beach (Panhandle), Stuart (Southeast), and Venice (Southwest). The schools were within a two-hour driving limit from the furthest chapter.

The final academy will be held in Ocala on January 7 and nineteen chapters will have an opportunity to attend. The school costs \$80 per student and includes an intense six hours of officer training and a light lunch.

We have received some interesting comments from our students and one of the main themes is, "I didn't know that you were going to teach that". The that, of that statement is our students are being given up-to-date and detailed knowledge of each officer's responsibilities. Statements like "I almost didn't come since I have been many times before and WOW, things have really changed" have been received.

Our instructors have spent many hours of travel crisscrossing the state giving up their weekends to share their knowledge. The District is truly indebted to these guys and we certainly appreciate their contributions.

The Ocala academy on January 7 will be opened to all officers who may have missed the opportunity to attend one of the earlier academies. The only requirement is that they let me know ahead of time so that we can plan for their attendance.

- 4) The 75th Anniversary Task Force, under the guidance of Roger Lewis, provided an extensive report on its activities. Special music has been composed by Joe Liles and Jay Giallambardo. Even with 1 1/2 years away, various events are shaping up to provide a fabulous week in Toronto!
- 5) The CEO Search Committee continues to work behind the scenes to find our next Society CEO. All of the applications have been received and candidates are being interviewed and the elimination process is underway. Larry Lewis and his committee are working hard and are leaving no stone unturned.
- 6) The New England Harmony Brigade was approved as the newest Society subsidiary.
- 7) A huge amount of time was spent going over work plans detailing income and expenditures. The 2012 Budget looks to be adequate to manage the Society for another year.
- 8) The Society District Liaisons took time to report on each of their districts to the SBOD. It was quite interesting to see how similar the state of the districts was. One interesting detail found that most district competitors were singing better than ever but the number of registrations to district conventions has been dropping off.
- 9) Reports were received from all eight of the functional Operations Team chairs. All are gearing up for the upcoming Operation Harold Hill in January 2012.

10) The President's Task Force/Guest Members chaired by Montana Jack Fitzpatrick found that non-member participation in various chapters was considered to be a minor problem in the Society and not worthy of any further board action.

From the Director's Point of View

More Planning

As we prepare to start a new year, with our chapter's new board, it's a great time to look back at 2011 and see what worked and what we could do better, and if you're like me, planning is one area that needs improvement. Our choruses spend 90% of their time in rehearsal and only 10% in performance. (Your mileage may vary, but you get the idea.) Because of this, it's critical for us as directors and chapter leaders to make sure we are prepared for the year ahead.

I'd hazard a guess that in many of our chapters, there was a big rush in the month before our show to get the show music in performance shape. Often we spend the 4 to 6 weeks before contest perfecting our contests set; we pull out our patriotic music in June so we can get ready for our 4th of July performances; and most of us started working on Christmas music in mid-October.

There has to be a better way to plan the year! In fact, could a lack of advanced planning be a factor that slows the learning process for your singers?

So, imagine this... Let's say our chapter's "musical year" begins right after our annual show and culminates with next year's annual show. So, if you do a March show, the "musical year" starts in April and ends with next March. It would be ideal if you sit down with your music team now and plan out the entire next "musical year". Choose songs for the summer, next Fall's Contest/Convention, next year's Christmas show, the Spring Convention and next year's annual show now and create a calendar of when each new song needs to be learned, ready for rehearsal. Once you've chosen the repertoire for the next musical year, go ahead and procure arrangements and learning materials now. And here's a key... What if we made the songs and LEARNING MATERIALS FOR NEXT YEAR available to our singers NOW?

We all have singers who learn quicker than others... Why not let those guys learn new songs at their own pace? This will keep them entertained and involved. AND, when it's time for the whole chorus to work the song, you have singers ready to help teach the song to the chorus which keeps your quick learners involved, and takes some work off your plate.

The keys to this idea... Plan the year ahead. Choose music and get learning materials early. Make it all

available to the chorus before the "musical year" even starts.

A chapter "member's only" website could be a great tool to make this happen. If you don't have one, you might want to take a look at <u>Groupanizer</u>. It's a web tool for choral groups, created by **Tom Metzger**, the **bass of "Realtime".** My chapter started using it this fall, and I can really see communication and organization improving drastically

Even More Planning

Here at budget time, remember that Director education could be the best money your chapter could ever spend. The chapter chorus director leads the musical success of your chapter. Music VPs, make sure your chapter has funds in your budget for director education.

This would include Society events like:

 <u>Harmony U/Directors College</u> – July 29-Aug 5, 2012 – The premier event for Director education. Scholarships are available for first time attendees.

District organized events like:

- <u>LeadAc</u> Your district's leadership academy for all of your chapter leaders.
- <u>CDWI I/CDWI II</u> Intensive one day workshops for front-line directors.
- <u>Next Level</u> Individualized coaching to help your chapter reach the "next level".
- <u>Outstanding in Front</u> Excellent training for music team and assistant directors.
- <u>Coaching for your chorus</u> Contact Harold Nance, SUN – VP Music and Performance, and bring in members of our outstanding Coaches Guild to work with your chorus.

Maybe even local training like:

- <u>Voice lessons</u> for the director what could he/ she learn that could be taught to the chorus?
- What else can you think of...?






from a piece of mesquite wood and I had a lot of practice on my new scroll saw cutting out the Brigade figurines & lettering.
