

Dialing in the 6000 Series Lido from Stem to Stern—Part 1 of Many By Dave Carroll

A little more than 8 years ago the Schock factory introduced the "new" Lido. Numbering of the classic boats ended with 5151, Mark Gaudio's boat, and a new era started with the 6000 series of Lidos. Contrary to many popular beliefs that the 6000 series would set the world afire, nothing revolutionary has happened. Top sailors with classic boats have continued to sail at the top of the fleet. Actually this is a tribute to the "one design" features of our class, since there are hundreds of old boats around that can be sailed competitively if properly set up and maintained. But some classics parts are no longer in manufacture. Upgrading is possible, but is usually more costly than imagined. And finally, let's face it, the "new" boat is the future of the class. Sure, there have been a few problems, but just try making a 2 or 3 digit classic into a Gold Flight trophy boat. It's not an economic decision, but a labor of love. The classic Lido represents over 40 years of history and what we love about the class— a simple, tactical, durable, family-oriented, etc., fun thing. The new boat can carry on the tradition, but there are a few things we can do to make it happen without a 40-year learning curve.

Starting at the bow: We have a new fitting for the headstay and tack of the jib. It's a bit lower than the original aluminum casting and our allowed changes permit the jib tack fitting to be extended to equalize things with the classic boat. A simple shackle is not the answer, however, since when sheeted hard, the shackle will rotate aft and to leeward, messing up the lower part of the jib at the entry. A simple rigid metal extension will do the trick, however, and can also provide the owner with a handy place to fasten the painter and/or tie-down line.


Another problem with the new bow and associated fitting is that there is little tolerance for damage. Have you ever misjudged a landing and crashed into the dock? Or maybe another boat (on port tack of course)? Don't answer this just yet—maybe an errant motorboat wake has caused your boat to crash into the dock. Of course, we all know this can happen. And when it does, there can be damage to the overhanging lip joining the hull and deck. The result is a potential separation of the deck and hull due to the headstay tension (this has happened with classic boats as well). Insurance to reduce the stress concentration at the two forward bolts (joining the deck and hull) is to fill the underside with "Marine-Tex" or another good filler to create a more impact resistant bow.

This modification provides insurance against the "angry alligator" bow separation that happened to Joe D'Amico at the 2002 Championship qualifications in which he most assuredly would have sailed in the Gold Flight with any other than DNF in the 3rd race.
