Apple's Predictive Keyboard

Apple's new predictive keyboard, which learns from how you type and tries to suggest words you might want to write next, can be great for typing a long text message. The predictive is a useful feature if you are a two finger typist. To turn on or off the keyboard's predictive features, go into your phone's Settings menu and then General > Keyboard. Scroll down to the Predictive setting and slide it to On or Off. From this menu, you can also disable other keyboard features that may annoy you, such as auto-capitalization, autocorrect, and spell check.

Airdrop

If you need to share a photo or file with a friend who is also using iPhone, then Airdrop can be a killer feature. Most of us will use it rarely if at all, though. Conserve battery power by turning Airdrop off; you can power it back on if and when you do want to share that selfie with your bestie.

To turn it off, simply swipe up to display your Control Center (that menu at the bottom of the screen where you can put the phone in airplane mode or access the calculator) and then tap on Airdrop. Tap Off to disable the feature.

Keep Voice Messages

In iOS 8, Apple added the ability to send voice messages to friends using iMessage. Those messages self-destruct, in part so you don't end up wasting storage space on messages you probably don't need anymore. But if you'd rather keep all the messages you receive, go into the Settings > Messages. Scroll down to Audio Messages and tap into the Expire menu. Then change their expiration from 2 Minutes to Never.

Location Services

If you just downloaded a slew on apps onto your new iPad then you probably noticed a surprising number of them ask to access your location. In addition to giving companies access to personal data you might rather they didn't have, location services also drains your battery (notice how precipitously battery life declines when the phones has to track you constantly for turn-by-turn directions, for instance.)

Find out which apps are asking for your location by going into Settings > Privacy > Location Services. Toggle the switches to Off for apps that don't really need to know where you are.

Automatic App Refreshes

Here's another battery-saver: Set your apps to update only when you want them to by going into Settings > General > Background App Refresh. From that page, you can opt to turn off all background app refreshes, or give just a few of your most important apps the ability to update on their own.

Spotlight Search

With iOS 8, Spotlight can bring up more elaborate search results than ever before... but it might not be the kind of content you're looking for. Limit the type of content that can show up in a Spotlight search by going to Settings > Spotlight Search and removing the check mark beside any type of content, such as voice memos or audiobooks, you'd rather not be included in your search results.

Choose Your Notifications

Like location services, push notifications can be customized for every app. So if you're getting too many annoying notes from that game that keeps asking you to come back and play, prevent it from sending push notifications by going into Settings > Notifications, where you can control notification settings for all your apps. From there, customize how many notifications (if any) will show up in the Notifications Center on your phone, as

TAKE A WALK THROUGH HISTORY

BOWRAL

- Start outside the Memorial Hall, which was built as a school of Arts in 1884, and operated as a
 Library from 1888 to 1945. Stafford Cottage next door was built in 1867, while the Bowral Town
 Hall was built in 1889 following the proclamation of Bowral as a municipality. The Court House
 on the corner of Bendooley and Wingecarribee street dates from 1895 and is built of Mt
 Gibralter sandstone. It was designed by Walter Liberty Vernon, who also designed the NSW Art
 Gallery and Sydney Central Station.
- Cross the road and head down Wingecarribee Street past Corbett Gardens which was proclaimed a park in 1911.
- Once you get to Bong Bong Street, you will be looking at the Grand Hotel which opened in 1888. The Royal Hotel, on the next corner to the right, was built in 1878 but its facade was substantially altered in the 1970's.
- Continue on Wingecarribee Street past the Grand and on your left are the Old Stables, built around 1860 the arched stable entry door can still be seen on the side, although it has been bricked up.
- Turn left into Station Street. On your right is the old CO-OP Building 1895 which used to be the central butter factory for the district, and the Milk Factory Building 1876 from where Sydney's milk supply was loaded onto trains.
- Turn left up Boolwey Street and walk a couple of blocks to Bowral School established in 1863, although the existing buildings date from 1893 and St Simon and St Jude's church. The first church, designed by Edmund Blacket, was built in 1874, although only the belicote remains from that building. The present church and rectory date from 1886.
