

HEALTHY LIVING

13,451 PEOPLE SERVED \$75,609 IN FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE PROVIDED

The Y is a leading voice on health and well-being. We bring families closer together, encourage good health, and foster connections through fitness, sports, fun, and shared interests. As a result, 13,451 people in our community are receiving the support, guidance, and resources they need to achieve greater health in spirit, mind, and body. This is particularly important as our nation struggles with an obesity crisis, families struggle with work/life balance, and individuals search for personal fulfillment. Our programs are accessible, affordable, and open to all faiths, backgrounds, abilities and income levels. In 2018, the Y served 13,451 people and provided \$75,609 in financial assistance to people who otherwise would have faced economic barriers to participation.

YOUTH DEVELOPMENT

4,881 YOUTH SERVED \$51,063 IN FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE PROVIDED

Our YMCA is committed to nurturing the potential of every child and teen. We believe that all kids deserve the opportunity to discover who they are and what they can achieve. That is why we help young people cultivate the values, skills, and relationships that lead to positive behaviors, better health, and educational achievement. Our YMCA programs, such as Kids Club, offer a range of experiences that enrich cognitive, social, and physical and emotional growth. Expenses include subsidies and direct financial assistance that make participation possible for 5% of the young people we engage. The YMCA programs served 4,881 youth and provided \$51,063 in financial aid in 2018.

In 2018, we engaged approximately 346 YMCA members, participants, and volunteers in activities that strengthen our community and pave the way for future generations to thrive.
