Brewer Bears Fight Hard on Homecoming, Fall to North Forney

The Brewer football team came up a bit short on Friday night, but not before giving one of the top 5A teams in the state an impressive fight.

The Bears lost to North Forney by a score of 49-37, and coach Todd Peterman said his team did a lot of things right in the final non-conference game of the season.

"We had a slow

second quarter and dug ourselves into a hold," Peterman said. "But the kids kept fighting and getting after it. That was a very, very talented football team we played, and we got better through out the game. We've gotten better every week. The kids are growing up."

Peterman said that he had a number of standout performances.

"Jordan Johnson, I talk about him every week, he went against a four or five star wide receiver, and the kid only had one catch," Peterman said. "So this is a freshman going against a senior who is going to Michigan State, and the freshman got the better of it. He's really special.

"Jaylen Spriggs came in at quarterback and did an exceptional job. Tyrelle Davis ran the ball really hard. We rushed for more than 300 yards again, and that was against a defense that had only given up 60 yards rushing all season."

The Bears have played some heavy hitters during the non-district portion of their schedule, and Peterman said he believes that has prepared his team well for district competition. "It's let us know where we are at and what we need to work on," Peterman said. "Unfortunately, we are 1-2. We'd like to be 3-0. But we do know some problem areas we need to get fixed."

Brewer opens up district this Friday with Saginaw, and Peterman said he expects a competitive contest.

"Last year, it was a pretty close game," Peterman said. "They ended up beating us and going to the playoffs, but they had more than 40 seniors last year."

Peterman said he is very proud of his nine senior athletes this season and the grit and determination they have demonstrated though out their time with the Bears program.

"They are all playing hard, contributing and leading," Peterman said. "They are nine tough kids who have made it through our system."

Brewer will play Saginaw at 7 p.m. tomorrow night at Rough Rider Stadium in Saginaw.

White Settlement City Council Approves Creation of Tax **Increment Reinvestment Zone**

On Tuesday, Oct. 6 the White Settlement City Council voted unanimously to approve the creation of a Tax Increment Reinvestment Zone (TIRZ) within the City of White Settlement.

A TIRZ is an economic development tool that captures the projected increase in tax revenue that is created by development within a defined area and reinvests those funds into public improvements and development projects that benefit the zone.

The creation of the TIRZ is part of a long term strategic plan developed in conjunction with our Citizens, Mayor, Council, City Manager, City Staff and the City's economic development consultant.

The primary focus of the TIRZ will be on infrastructure improvements in the zone that will help development already present as well as make the area more attractive for future development.

The TIRZ funds will not be used to issue new debt and will instead be saved in an account where only what is available will be used.

This approach makes sure that the TIRZ does not create any new impact on White Settlement taxpayers via debt service payments.

While the creation of the TIRZ has already taken place, work is still underway finalizing the TIRZ area and identifying the first projects that will be pursued within it.

map shows what areas are being considered.






