

# ADULT EVENING DIPLOMA PROGRAM

# ~ENGLISH~

ENGLISH 1 Students will focus on becoming skillful readers through the close analysis of multiple genres of literature. Students will use the language of literary elements and devices as they generate precise observations in oral and written form.

MONDAY

**ENGLISH 2** Students will focus on becoming skillful readers by closely examining the language in literary works. Students will examine the quality of the language that writers use and the precise way things are said. Through a close study of literature, students will analyze intricate and subtle language patterns, connotative suggestions, diction, tone, figurative language, word choice and style.

**MONDAY** 

**ENGLISH 3** Students will focus on developing a variety of strategies in writing effective essays. Practice in a process approach to writing will continue.

**WEDNESDAY** 

ENGLISH 4 Students will read, analyze, and respond to a wide range of literature representing various cultures, genres, styles, time periods, and aesthetic theories. Students will determine the artistic and moral intentions of each text, and will focus on establishing their own critical voices and literature and about the values reflected in it.

WEDNESDAY

JUNIOR ENGLISH The Junior Year English program offers students a semester course with particular emphasis on writing. Students will focus on developing a variety of strategies in writing effective essays. Practice in a process approach to writing will continue. This class meets twice a week. (Day School) Fee: \$250 MONDAY & WEDNESDAY

## -MCAS-

MCAS ENGLISH REVIEW This course will review MCAS test-taking strategies, literacy skills, questions similar to the MCAS multiple choice, open responses and long composition formats to aid in instruction and MCAS, SAT, and ACCUPLACER® preparation. MONDAY

MCAS BIOLOGY REVIEW This course is designed to raise the Biology competency level of students who have already taken Biology 1 and Biology 2 but have not passed the Biology MCAS, SAT, and ACCUPLACER® preparation.

TUESDAY & THURSDAY

MCAS MATH REVIEW This course will review topics including number sense, patterns, Algebra, Geometry, data analysis, statistics and probability. This course is appropriate for students who want additional support in essential skills for MCAS, SAT, and ACCUPLACER® preparation.

TUESDAY & THURSDAY

Classes with insufficient enrollment are subject to cancellation.

ALGEBRA 1 This college preparatory course deals with topics including the properties of the real number system, polynomials and factoring, equations, inequalities, linear equations, quadratic equations, rational equations, radicals, graphing, exponents, basic statistics and problem solving. THURSDAY

ALGEBRA 2\* This course extends the fundamental skills and concepts of Algebra 1. Topics that are explored include the properties of the real number system and its subsystems, polynomials, equations, inequalities problem solving, systems of equations and graphing functions.

TUESDAY

\*PREREQUISITE ALGEBRA 1

**GEOMETRY 1** This course touches on all fundamental topics of Geometry: inductive and deductive reasoning, triangles, congruence, similarity, polygons, surface area and volume, circles and right triangle trigonometry.

THURSDAY

GEOMETRY 2\* This is a course in plane and solid Euclidean geometry. Topics included are: plane and solid geometric figures, similarity and proportion, measure of area and volume, and coordinate geometry.

# ~SCIENCE~

BIOLOGY 1 This course will focus on cell structure and function, cellular respiration, and reproduction. Students will gain a better understanding of themselves and the basic processes needed for life by participating in laboratory experiments, multimedia, hands-on learning activities, and projects. TUESDAY

**BIOLOGY 2\*** This biochemistry course will focus on photosynthesis, genetics, and the systems of the human body. Students will participate in laboratory experiments, multimedia, hands-on learning activities, and projects. \*PREREQUISITE - BIOLOGY I

WEDNESDAY

# -SOCIAL SCIENCE-

20<sup>TH</sup> CENTURY WORLD HISTORY 20th Century World History explores the economic and political roots of the modern world, the causes and consequences of the great military and economic events, and the rise of nationalism and the continuing persistence of political, ethnic, and religious conflicts around the world.

MONDAY

**U. S. HISTORY 1** U. S. States History 1 examines the establishment of the nation and its struggles including the American Revolution, the development of the government, issues surrounding slavery, and events leading up to and including the Civil War and Reconstruction.

WEDNESDAY

**U. S. HISTORY 2** U. S. History 2 examines the history of the United States from the Reconstruction to the present, including many outstanding achievements as well as the nation's major challenges.

THURSDAY

# -ELECTIVES-

AMERICAN LEGAL SYSTEM This course examines the criminal and civil justice systems. The uniqueness of the American legal system is explored through a thorough analysis of the Federal Constitution and the Bill of Rights.

MONDAY

CAREER EXPLORATION (This course will provide students with the foundation for understanding, planning, and developing ethical strategies to help make them financially successful and knowledgeable adults. Using appropriate software applications, students will analyze personal financial management including banking services, consumer credit, student loans, savings and checking accounts, the basics of borrowing money, renting an apartment, and home ownership.

THURSDAY

CIVICS This course addresses authority, responsibility, and power as dynamic themes within the American context. The founding documents, principles, and practices of American government and citizenship are examined in detail.

TUESDAY

21<sup>ST</sup> CENTURY TECHNOLOGY & COMPUTING Students will use Microsoft Word, Excel and Power Point to create common school and business documents. Students will also learn how to effectively use 21st century technology such as the internet, Moodle, Twitter and distance learning. TUESDAY

**GRAPHICS** This course is designed to provide students with an introduction to graphics theory and design using the computer software Adobe CS4<sup>TM.</sup> Students will also learn to use equipment that is used in the graphics industry to complete and package jobs to be distributed. Students will learn by doing in this course.

THURSDAY

# ~HEALTH AND WELLNESS~

HEALTHY LIVING Students will analyze the impact of technology, media, politics and individual choices with regard to health concerns. They will learn how to make healthy food choices for proper weight management and overall well-being. Students will understand how to secure reliable information and resources in order to make well-informed decisions regarding their physical, mental, emotional and social health. WEDNESDAY

#### WHO MAY ENROLL

Adults who wish to complete their high school diploma or take a refresher course or preparatory course for further training or education may enroll. Students transferring from another school, must provide a transcript and proof of withdrawal from their previous school.
