Chi Psi Omega Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated hosted 2K16 Community Health Fair: A focus on Family Health, Cancer Awareness and Prevention, to kickoff National Breast Cancer Awareness Month; Saturday, October 1, 2016, at the Northwest Regional Library in Coral Springs. More than 275 families and community participants were in attendance; the second largest in the chapters history based on registration sign-in. Participants received health information, participated in demonstrations, raffles and giveaways.
