Buckeyes Open B1G Play at Penn State

The Ohio State men's soccer team opens Big Ten play on the road at Penn State at 1 p.m. Sunday at Jeffrey Field in University Park, Pa.

KICKING OFF

- Brian Maisonneuve claimed his first career win in a 1-0 victory over Hofstra Aug. 26 in Columbus.
- Last time out, Ohio State and Bowling Green battled to a 1-1 double overtime draw Tuesday night in Columbus.
- Maisonneuve was associate head coach at Indiana University, guiding the team to the 2012 NCAA national title. He was a member of the Columbus Crew from 1996-2004.
- The Buckeyes have had nine members make their OSU debuts this season. Ohio State has had a different backline start in four of the five matches.
- Ohio State returns six starters from the 2017 squad and welcomes seven newcomers. The Buckeyes lost seven letterwinners and five starters from the team that finished 8-10-1 overall and 3-5 in conference play.
- The Buckeyes were picked tied for sixth

- with Penn State in the Big Ten preseason poll announced last week. Indiana was picked as the preseason favorite followed by Michigan State, Maryland, Michigan and Wisconsin.
- Senior Brady Blackwell, redshirt junior Parker Siegfried and sophomore Will Hirschman were named to the Big Ten preseason honors list.
- The Buckeyes are averaging 11.7 shots per game and 0.0 goals per game this season. The team has a shot on goal percentage of .357.
- Jake Scheper and Joshua Jackson-Ketchup each have scored this year.
- Michael Proasuk leads the Buckeyes with 15 shots, while Scheper has 11 shots, including a team-high five on target.
- Ohio State has had a 34-26 lead in corners.

A NEW ERA OF OSU MEN'S SOCCER

Head coach Brian Maisonneuve is in his first year as head coach of the Buckeyes. Maisonneuve comes from Indiana University where he was associate head coach for the Hoosiers. As one of the top assistants in the country, Maisonneuve guided Indiana to the 2012 NCAA national title, a NCAA runner-up finish in 2017, the 2010 Big Ten regular season title as well as the 2013 Big Ten tournament championship. Maisonneuve, a native of Warren, Mich., was one of the top players in Indiana soccer history, winning the Hermann Trophy in 1994. He spent nine seasons with the Columbus Crew from 1996-2004 and was a member of the United States' 1998 World Cup team. Maisonneuve is assisted by associate head coach Sergio Gonzalez, assistant coach Matt Foldesy and director of operations Chad Barson.

LAST TIME OUT

Ohio State tied Bowling Green in double overtime, 1-1, last Tuesday in Columbus. Ohio State broke a scoring drought in the second half when Joshua Jackson-Ketchup buried his first goal of the season in the 72nd minute. However, the Falcons found an equalizer with nine seconds remaining in regulation to force overtime. Parker Siegfried finished the match with four saves.

SCOUTING PENN STATE

The Nittany Lions (1-4-0) are led by first-year head coach Jeff Cook. Their lone win came against Bowling Green in a 1-0 home victory Aug. 28 at Jeffrey Field. Penn State will be well rested as the team's match vs. High Point was cancelled on Tuesday. Jeremy Rafanello has scored a pair of goals, while goalkeeper Josh Levine has a 1.17 goals-against average with 19 saves this season.

THE SERIES

Penn State leads the all-time series vs. the Nittany Lions, 18-14-4. Last season, the Buckeyes won, 3-0, in Columbus. Mitch Bergman scored his first collegiate goal in the 85th minute.

IN BIG TEN OPENERS

Ohio State is 21-6-0 in Big Ten regular season openers since 1991.

A LOOK BACK AT DAYTON TOURNAMENT

Ohio State battled, but fell in two 1-0 losses at the Dayton Tournament Aug. 31-Sept. 2. The Buckeyes fell, 1-0, against Marshall Aug. 31. The Herd scored the lone goal of the match in the second minute. Despite controlling play for the majority of the match, Ohio State could not find an equalizer as both sides played with 10 men for the final 35 minutes of the match. The Buckeyes dropped a 1-0 loss vs. Milwaukee last time out Sept. 2. Parker Siegfried made three saves in the

match, while Jacob Goyen made his first career start and Christian Harter made his first collegiate appearance in the second half vs. the Panthers. For their efforts, Brady Blackwell and Joshua Jackson-Ketchup were named to the Dayton All-Tournament Team.

WOLSTEIN RECAP

Ohio State went 1-1-0 at the 13th annual Wolstein Classic last weekend in Columbus. The team fell, 2-0, in its opener vs. Furman Friday night before rebounding a 1-0 shutout victory over Hofstra last Sunday at Jesse Owens Memorial Stadium. Jake Scheper scored the lone goal on the weekend on a penalty kick vs. the Pride in the 65th minute. The Buckeyes outshot Hofstra, 18-8, and had a 5-3 in corners. Junior CC Uche (two starts in defense) and freshman Xavier Green were each named to the Wolstein Classic All-Tournament team.

THE NEWCOMERS

Head coach Brian Maisonneuve and his staff welcomed a total of seven new faces to its 2018 roster. The incoming class is made up of two transfers and five freshmen – Osman Fofanah, CC Uche, Xavier Green, Cory DuBois, Colin Lynch, Chaise Thiel and Daniel Wee. After missing last year due to injury, redshirt junior transfer Jake Scheper and redshirt freshman Devyn Etling are ready to make an impact this fall.

FREE FOR ALL

The Buckeyes' schedule includes 10 matches at Bert L. & Iris S. Wolstein Field at Jesse Owens Memorial Stadium this season with home Big Ten action kicking off Sept. 21 against Northwestern. Admission is free to all Ohio State men's soccer regular-season home games.

HOME BROADCAST SCHEDULE

The Ohio State men's soccer team will make two appearances on national television this fall. The Buckeyes will be seen on ESPNU Sept. 25 at Michigan and BTN Sept. 30 at home against Rutgers. All other home matches will be on BTN Plus (\$).

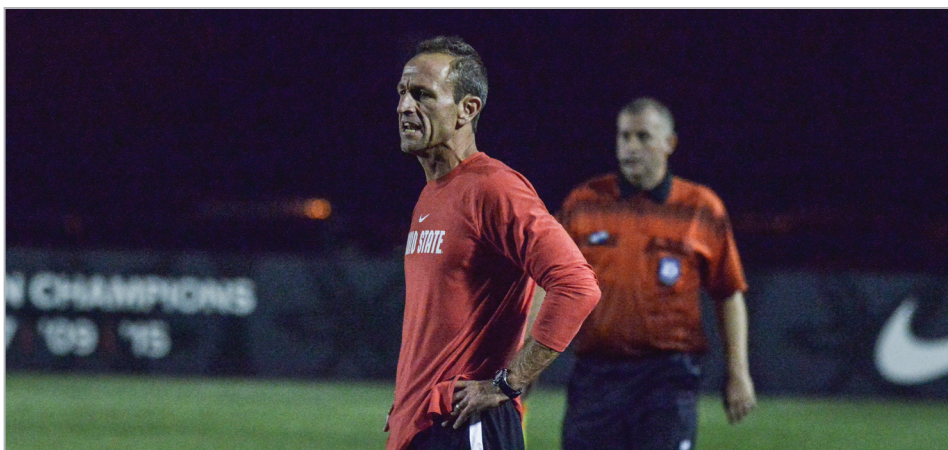

BRIAN MAISONNEUVE HEAD COACH

1ST SEASON, INDIANA '95



Maisonneuve will lead the Buckeyes on the pitch for the first time as head coach this weekend

Brian Maisonneuve, associate head coach of the Indiana men's soccer program and former member of the U.S. National Team and Columbus Crew, has been named head men's soccer coach at The Ohio State University, announced Monday, April 23, 2018.

"We are fortunate to add Brian Maisonneuve to our outstanding lineup of head coaches," Gene Smith, Ohio State Senior Vice President and Wolfe Foundation Endowed Director of Athletics said. "He has competed at a high level and coached in one of the most successful collegiate programs nationally. We look forward to the opportunities our student-athletes will have under Brian's direction."

One of the top assistants in all of college soccer for the past decade, wherever Maisonneuve has coached, success has followed. He helped guide the Hoosiers to the 2012 NCAA national championship, a NCAA runner-up finish in 2017, the 2010 Big Ten Regular Season Title as well as the 2013 Big Ten Tournament Championship.

"First of all I want to thank Gene Smith, Shaun Richard and the entire committee for giving me this incredible opportunity to lead The Ohio State University men's soccer program," Maisonneuve said. "My family and I are so excited to get back to Columbus and join the Buckeye family."

In all, Maisonneuve helped lead Indiana to eight NCAA Tournament appearances, including two College Cups and four NCAA Sweet 16 appearances. An All-American during his playing days for the Hoosiers (1991-94), Maisonneuve has been a part of Todd Yeagley's staff for the last nine years, coaching nine All-Americans as well as 22 players who have gone on to play professional soccer, including 14 in MLS.

"I also want to thank Todd Yeagley, Fred Glass and the entire IU Athletics Department for my years in Bloomington," Maisonneuve said. "IU is a very special place to me. I am so thankful and appreciative for my time in Bloomington as a player and a coach. There will always be a special place in my heart for the entire Hoosier Nation."

"I am excited to get to work and continue to grow the Ohio State program into one of the elite soccer programs in the country. John [Bluem] did a great job over the last 21 years and I am so honored for this opportunity. This is an incredible athletics department with tremendous resources."

Maisonneuve, who replaces John Bluem who announced his retirement in March, was named the NSCAA Assistant Coach of the Year for the Great Lakes Region in 2012 and 2015. In 2016, he was named one of the Top 12 assistants in the nation for the third straight year and fifth time in his career. Since 2010, the Hoosiers have had 21 players named first team All-Big Ten and 50 student-athletes earn Big Ten honors. IU players also have earned nine conference player of the year accolades. The Hoosiers also have excelled in the classroom, compiling 102 Academic All-Big Ten honors.

"Our search committee conducted a very thorough national search and during that process, Brian Maisonneuve's name continued to come up," Shaun Richard, associate AD, sport administration, said. "His experience as a player at the highest level, working with a national championship program as a coach and his high character and core values as a person made him the perfect fit for our program. I'm excited to work with Brian moving forward to execute his vision for Ohio State men's soccer."

Prior to his return to Bloomington, Maisonneuve was on staff at the University of Louisville from 2008-09. During his two seasons, the Cardinals were 24-11-4 overall and 13-7-1 in Big East play with two NCAA Tournament appearances.

Maisonneuve spent four years as an assistant coach with the U.S. U-17 National Team in Florida. He also served as an assistant coach for the U.S. U-20 National Team in 2007 during the CONCACAF qualification process and coached the U-20s in the 2007 FIFA World Cup in Canada.

Before joining the coaching ranks, Maisonneuve had a decorated playing career. He spent nine seasons

with the Columbus Crew from 1996-2004 and was a member of the United States' 1998 World Cup team, appearing in all three matches. He was also a member of the 1996 U.S. Olympic team, leading the squad with a pair of goals in the tournament.

Maisonneuve, a native of Warren, Mich., is one of the top players in Indiana soccer history. Playing alongside Todd Yeagley, under legendary coach Jerry Yeagley, he earned All-America honors as a junior and senior and was named the Hermann Trophy winner in 1994. A two-time Big Ten Player of the Year, Maisonneuve finished his career with 44 goals and 22 assists and led Indiana to a pair of NCAA College Cup appearances and back-to-back Big Ten regular season titles. During his four years at Indiana the Hoosiers were 73-15-7. He also was a four-time All-Big Ten selection and three-time Academic All-Big Ten selection. Maisonneuve earned his bachelor's degree from Indiana.

"The City of Columbus has always been like a second home for Diania and me. We can't wait to get back and get started."

Maisonneuve and his wife Diania have two children, Jacob and Emma.
