The Summer of the Ride gives the community two ways to celebrate the 25th anniversary — ride with us or ride their own way between August 1 and 21, 2020.

The Ride for Roswell, presented by the West Herr Automotive Group, introduced the Summer of the Ride, a re-imagined event offering multiple riding options between August 1 and 21. The Ride is traditionally held on a Saturday in late June following the Celebration of Hope, an evening ceremony the night before paying tribute to the cancer community. Due to the current

climate and concerns about how long the need for caution will last, the usual single-day format will be replaced with summer-long engagement opportunities offering many different ways for riders to participate, fundraise and connect with others. The Summer of the Ride will consist of the lighting of the torch on June 27; fundraising challenges, engagement and ways

With the NFL season on Hold . . . we are looking back at Buffalo Sabres games.

On May 5th 1989, Alexander Mogilny defected from the Soviet Union to play for the Buffalo Sabres. The 20 year old Mogilny had played for the Soviet national team and their Red Army hockey club where his forward line with Sergei Fedorov and Pavel Bure was one of the best in the world. Mogilny was in his third year with the Central Red Army team and had played on both the 1988 Soviet Olympic team and the national junior team. Mogilny had been selected 89th overall by the Sabres in the 1988 NHL Entry Draft after he had been selected at the best forward at the 1988 World Juniors tournament. He was voted the world's best junior player by NHL scouts in a poll conducted by The Hockey News.

Mogilny met Sabres officials GM Gerry Meehan and Don Luce, the Sabres' director of amateur development, at a mall in Sweden where the Soviet team had been playing in a tournament. The three then flew to JFK Airport New York City, where Mogilny was interviewed by the FBI. The then flew

to Buffalo.

At the time the U.S. and Soviet Union were still embroiled in a Cold War and relations were not cordial. The Soviet players on the Red Army team were also soldiers in the military, Mogilny was a second lieutenant and his defection was considered desertion from the Army. A Soviet military court charged him with desertion. Mogilny was reviled as a traitor.

A military prosecutor was quoted as saying that if he was convicted, the Soviet Union would demand his extradition to serve his sentence, Desertion by an officer during peace time carried a maximum sentence of seven years at hard labor. Soviet Coach Viktor Tikhonov called the defection "disgusting."

Sabres GM Meehan, also an attorney, said, "I'm not surprised they are upset. When you are involved in something like this, you view it as a business situation." Meehan said many details still needed to be worked out, including Mogilny's

official status here.

Mogilny was eventually granted asylum and settled in Buffalo and began his career as a Sabre. He wore the number 89 in recognition of his place in the draft and the year he defected. In his third season he scored 39 goals and 84 points in 67 games. The next season, 1992-1993, he scored 76 goals in 77 games, and 127 points while playing with Pat LaFontaine, who had 148 points with 53 goals and 95 assists.

In the meantime the Soviet Union dissolved but the old Soviet Union mentality lived on with an attitude that if one was successful then another wanted a piece of that success and your failure to share could cost you dearly, even your life. This became known as the Russian Mafia. But there was no Mafia, it was really just a way of life there, the way things were done. And it followed Mogilny to Buffalo in 1994. Sergei Fomitchev was a friend who had helped Mogilny defect lived with him in Buffalo for a time. He tried to extort \$150,000 from Mogilny who sought help from the FBI. Fomitchev was jailed and eventually deported.

In his career Mogilny scored 1,032 points (473-559) in 990 regular season games with Buffalo, Vancouver, Toronto and New Jersey.

From page one ways we can do that despite everything that's happened the past few months," says Mitch Flynn, the founder of the Ride for Roswell. "At the end of the day, the Ride is about the people we ride for. Cancer doesn't stop, and neither can we. We still need to fund new research and clinical trials. We still need to keep finding better treatments until we discover a cure. We still need to save lives. I can't wait to see what we do together with these new Ride options this year as we fight to make those things happen."

There are now two ways to participate in the Summer of the Ride:

- Ride with us: Small, physically distant rides will be planned for weekend days in August. On these dates, small groups

will leave every 20 minutes from a variety of locations around Western New York. Location details will be announced in June.

- Ride your own way: Participants ride any distance, any time and at any location between August 1 and 21. Riders can cycle around their neighborhoods, ride their favorite trails, stay at home on their trainers or do anything else that represents the Ride for Roswell to them.

"We're excited to be part of this re-imagined Ride, and to see how everyone finds a way to ride this summer," says Matt Lasher, Marketing Director for the West Herr Automotive Group. "West Herr continues to be a supporter of the Ride for Roswell because everyone has been touched by cancer

in some way, and every day we see how that support makes a difference for the people of Western New York. The Ride is an amazing show of unity, community and support that brings us together every year, and this year we might need it more than ever. We're proud to be a part of it once again."

With the re-imagination of the Ride, and in the spirit of building our Ride community in new ways, the Ride is eliminating both registration fees and fundraising minimums for 2020. For riders who already paid a registration fee prior to May 1, fees will be applied to their fundraising totals, and they will receive free Ride registration in 2021.

To participate, riders must register online at RideforRoswell.org. The funds raised this year by the Summer of the Ride are more important than ever. They will benefit critical and innovative cancer research at Roswell Park Comprehensive Cancer Center, including cutting edge clinical trials and groundbreaking immunotherapy studies that bring the future of cancer treatment to patients who need them today.

This year, the Ride for Roswell is celebrating its 25th anniversary. Since 1996, riders and volunteers of all ages have raised more than \$53 million for cancer research and patient care programs at Roswell Park. The funds raised through the Ride for Roswell have helped Roswell Park researchers investigate new treatment options; facilitated clinical trials for both common and rare types of cancers; supported the costs of important medical testing not covered by insurance; and made possible quality of life programs that assist with non-medical needs and help patients remember that cancer doesn't define them.



Ask Rusty - Husband Confused About Spouse Benefit

Dear Rusty: I am 65 and still working and plan to work for some time to come. My birthdate is February 1955. My wife is 64 and not working. Her birthdate is January 1956. Half of my benefit is more than half of hers. I am confused on the spousal benefit rules. If she were to take her Social Security early before she reaches her full retirement age, what are the rules that affect her? Signed: Confused Husband

Dear Confused: First I must clarify that spousal benefits do not work as you have suggested, that "half of my benefit is more than half of hers." Spousal benefits are always based upon the amount the individuals are due at their full retirement age, regardless of the age at which they claim. If half

of your benefit at your full retirement age (FRA) is more than your wife's full benefit at her full retirement age, then the difference between those two numbers is a "spousal boost" which is added to your wife's own payment amount when her spouse benefit starts. If she has reached her FRA when you claim and her spouse benefit starts, your wife will get the entire spousal boost; if she has not, the spousal boost will be reduced. Your wife cannot collect a spousal benefit until you start collecting your Social Security, so if she claims benefits before you claim she will initially get only what she is entitled to on her own work record. Then when you claim, the "spousal boost" will be added to her benefit. If you claim at your FRA, your wife will not

yet have reached her full retirement age, so her spousal boost amount will be reduced and added to her own reduced benefit amount, making her total benefit as your spouse less than 50% of your FRA benefit amount.

Your full retirement age is 66 years and 2 months, and you won't be entitled to full benefits until you reach that age. For your awareness, you can wait beyond your FRA and earn delayed retirement credits, up to age 70 when your benefit would be about 31% more than it would be at your FRA, but your wife cannot get her spousal boost until you claim. And also for your awareness, if you claim benefits before you reach your FRA and continue to work, you'll be subject to Social Security's earnings limit (\$18,240 for 2020) which, if exceeded, will cause SS to take back some of your benefits. The earnings limit goes up by about 2.5 times in the year you reach your FRA and goes away when you reach your full retirement age.

Your wife's full retirement age is 66 years and 4 months and any benefits she claims on her own

record prior to reaching that age will be reduced. At 64 she could claim her own benefit from her own work record (assuming she has at least 40 SS credits), but that benefit would be reduced to about 85% of what she would get at her FRA. And claiming at age 64 would also affect the amount of her spousal benefit when that starts. The only way your wife can get 100% of the amount she is due as your spouse is to wait until her FRA to claim any benefit. If she claims her own benefit at age 64 or any time before her FRA, not only will her own benefit be reduced, but her

eventual benefit as your spouse will be less than 50% of your FRA benefit amount, even if you wait to claim until your wife reaches her FRA. That's because her spousal boost, when it occurs, will be added to the reduced SS retirement amount she is getting because she claimed before her full retirement age.

You are certainly not alone to be confused about spousal benefits as this is one of the most confusing areas of Social Security's rules. But I hope the above provides what you and your wife need to make an informed claiming decision.
