A Message From Your State Deputy, Salvatore A. Restivo

I can't believe how far we have come in what seems to be a short time. Our organizational meeting was held in July in Suffern, New York. I know that a State Deputy's installation the second time around may seem to be "Old Hat" but for me it was special. Last year, as you may recall, Margie was recuperating from major surgery and could not be with us. At that time, Bishop Murphy jeweled me as your State Deputy. This year, Margie, in perfect health, was there to do the honors. I am grateful and blessed to have my wife of 39 years with me in my life and with me as I have the honor of being your state deputy. Any state council event has a variety of sub plots but for me having my wife by my side made it all the more special as I recommit myself to "Building His Dream".

Our supreme convention was interesting and worthwhile. Our Supreme convention focused upon the issue of Religious Freedom. I had an opportunity to meet with Cardinal Dolan, the Supreme Advocate John Marrella and Assistant Supreme Advocate Michael O'Connor. Our discussion focused upon the New York State Council's non partisan voter registration initiative entitled the "Summer of Catholic Citizenry". Our Cardinal fully supports our efforts. We are seeking the cooperation of all the bishops in New York State. While this is a new endeavor for the State council.


