

#### 2016 FND-OF-THF-YFAR UPDATE

Two miracles have happened in the past four months with our work here in Israel. First, the Bram Center (the Jerusalem-based ministry of First Fruits of Zion) is now a legally recognized non-profit organization in Israel. Second, God is adding uniquely qualified individuals to our small staff for this work—we're now established to do even greater things here in the Land.

I want to thank each of you who have been with us thus far in prayer and support. We're in a time of miracles. Now we need one more miracle: the remaining financing to complete the purchase of the facility that the Bram Center currently rents. We have an opportunity to be securely and permanently established here in Jerusalem and we need your help.

Our work has never been about acquiring buildings or physical assets. It has always been about our mission to communicate the message of Yeshua as the Messiah within his proper Jewish context. So, let me explain why it is important for us to own our facility.

We bring a controversial message that is very unpopular in Israel. Our Messianic appeal for Yeshua in his own

land, among his people, motivates powerful challengers who reject our message and mission. Renting a facility and depending on landlords who are potentially subject to pressure and coercion from opponents of our message leaves us in a vulnerable and tenuous position. So long as we are merely tenants, our future remains uncertain. Ownership of the facility removes those insecurities and grants us every legal right to provide a physical place for Messianic Judaism in the heart of Jerusalem.

Stepping forward in faith in August, we signed a purchase agreement, fully trusting God to work through you and others. Thanks be to God, thus far we've raised a little more than half of the purchase price—we have a remaining need of \$340,000. This is a matter of urgency because we need to close on the property by the end of December. I have confidence in the work that God is doing here with the center, and I have faith that he will provide for our need.

Please prayerfully consider joining us in the good work we are doing here in Jerusalem by contributing toward this need. Israel needs to see Yeshua in his Jewishness—they need to see him in an authentic Messianic Jewish context.

Would you give a one-time gift toward this need? If each of you receiving this letter were to contribute a one-time gift (as you are able) I am confident this transformational need will be met.

We believe that HaShem opened this door, and we felt led to walk through it. Thank you for your prayerful consideration, and thank you for all that you have already done through your friendship, prayer, and support.

As a recognition of our collective efforts to make this a reality—we will be tastefully placing the names of all contributors on a plaque in the Bram Center in Jerusalem. Please join with us in making this place a permanent reality.

#### Support and identity

The Bram Center has served as a place of support and identity for me—in spiritual and practical ways. #### Giving up on faith

Having grown up as a Jewish follower of Yeshua here in Israel I've struggled with how I fit into the Jewish landscape of the land. Many of my friends have reconciled these discrepancies by giving up on faith to become secular. The Bram Center has been a source of learning and encouragement for me to connect with other Jewish believers who are working through these issues, maintaining faith, and maturing in our understanding of Jewish life as devout followers of Messiah Yeshua. – A.B., Jerusalem.

#### Rooted in the Land

I have found the Messianic Jewish movement in Israel to be inconsistent and extremely diverse. I have come to value what I am learning through The Bram Center because it is rooted in the land and also connects within the culture, heritage, and tradition of our people to build our identity as a Yeshua community in Israel. – *Noach B., Jerusalem*.

#### No longer relevant

I was moved by how God is using The Bram Center in big ways in such a short period of time. One afternoon, for example, several Israelis began showing up for one-on-one study times. One of the Israelis is an Orthodox rabbi who does not yet believe in Yeshua. This man has been attending Bram Center activities for some time now. He has found The Bram Center to be a place where he can learn about Yeshua in an environment that affirms Judaism and can engage him on a level that he can relate to. #### An active place

My wife (Martha) and I have been in Israel since 1979 pioneering Messianic Judaism and the Jewish understanding of Jesus with our lives and through my Bible translations and theological books such as The Jewish New Testament and The Complete Jewish Bible. Having moved into a new phase of life, I was honored to dedicate my complete reference library (4K books) to the Bram Center. It is an active place of learning and dialog and will carry on my life's work developing Messianic Judaism. It will continue to challenge the conventional view of Jesus within Judaism and be there for the next generation. We are so pleased with what we see happening in the Bram Center. #### A wide impact

Our congregation in Jerusalem, which is one of the oldest Messianic congregations in the land, tries to highlight the references to the Messiah in the weekly Torah portion, and specifically what the rabbis have written about him. I couldn't do this without the Shadows of the Messiah commentaries [obtained through the Bram Center], which summarize the Messianic references from a wide variety of rabbinic literature. These commentaries are a key part of my preparation for teaching the Torah portion. Unfortunately, not everyone can read English well enough to digest the commentaries, and even if they can, they have to translate the commentaries and locate the rabbinic sources, which is not easy for people unfamiliar with rabbinic literature. If this material was in Hebrew, it would have a wider impact in Israel and it could also be used to help start dialogue between Messianic and Orthodox Jews. - Adam Focht, Precept Ministries, Jerusalem.

The Bram Center is already established and functioning, and all monthly expenses are already covered by the ministry of First Fruits of Zion through our generous FFOZ Friends, but we need help to make this the permanent home for our ministry. With God's help all things are possible.
