### The Second Eucharistic Prayer

The second Eucharistic Prayer is the shortest. It traces its origin back to the second century from an early Christian writer named Hippolytus. In his writing, he describes the prayers that are said over the bread and the wine at a gathering of Christians. The English translation is almost word for word as the current. Eucharistic Prayer. The scholarship on this prayer is a little debatable and its origins in the second century has been riddled with doubt.

However, it is a Eucharistic Prayer



approved by the Church for use in Mass. What should amaze us is the fact that this prayer was used by the early Christians. and is used by us today.

### Pastoral Message

Dear Parishioners.

'Diabolical' is a word that is often used to describe the devil or evil. It literally means 'to divide' or 'to scatter'. It was Lucifer, the angel of light, that is credited with beginning the Great War in heaven among God and His angels. The twelfth chapter in the Book of Revelation, the final book of the Bible, tells us that after the war, the dragon was thrown out of heaven and lost his place. The dragon then attempted to consume woman's child. The woman is given wings to fly away. The dragon, upset at her victory, wages war on all her children. The dragon is Satan. The woman is Mary. The child is Jesus. We are her children. Evil is always the source of division.

Jesus often speaks of His people being one in the unity of the Holy Spirit. Many people today no longer believe in spiritual realities. If they do, they usually do so solely for their own desires for control in their lives. We all feel powerless at times to change our circumstances and the challenges that face our country and our world. Our reaction to this powerlessness is to work for unity in the Holy Spirit. Our work in this life is to sacrifice our own truths for the truth of the gospel. When the importance of this sacrifice is forgotten, division follows. We do need to remember that the source of this division is not the truth of the gospel, but the lie of evil.

The reality of this unity is evidenced in joy. When we possess the joy of the Holy Spirit, we can more deeply trust God and each other. This is never a shallow joy, but one that emanates from the deep reality of the Holy Trinity within each one of us as baptized Christians. The primary witness of this is in the Eucharist and the celebration of the Holy Mass. We encounter the divisive intent of evil, by unity in truth. The truth is not a thing, it is a person. Jesus said I am the Way, the Truth and the Life.

The evidence of true unity is witness in the genuine love and concern a group has for each other. This is the reason why it is so great to see people at events like the Wing Ding. This is seen also in weddings and marriages, baptism and First Communion parties and even funerals. One of the significant reasons why we would put an addition on our facility is to help give people in our parish during these events a place to celebrate these milestone moments in the lives of their families. A culture of joy in the truth of the Holy Spirit will naturally attract.

## Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus

Jesus Made Twelve Promises to Those Who Hold a True Devotion to His Sacred Heart:

- 1. I will give them all the graces necessary in their state of life.
- 2. I will give peace in their families and will unite families that are divided.
- 3. I will console them in all their troubles.
- 4. I will be their refuge during life and above all in death.
- 5. I will bestow the blessings of Heaven on all their enterprises.
- 6. Sinners shall find in my Heart the source and infinite ocean of mercy.
- 7. Tepid souls shall become fervent.
- 8. Fervent souls shall rise quickly to great perfection.
- 9. I will bless those places wherein the image of My Heart shall be exposed and honored and will imprint My love on the hearts of those who would wear this image on their person. I will also destroy in them all disordered movements.
- 10. I will give to priests who are animated by a tender devotion to my Divine Heart the gift of touching the most hardened hearts.
- 11. Those who promote this devotion shall have their names written in my Heart, never to be effaced.
- 12. THE GREATEST PROMISE I promise you in the excessive mercy of my Heart that my all-powerful love will grant to all those who communicate (Receive Holy Communion) on the First Friday in nine consecutive months, the grace of final penitence: they will not die in my disgrace, nor without receiving their Sacraments. My Divine Heart shall be their safe refuge in this last moment.

It is important to note in order to obtain the GREAT PROMISE that the Nine Fridays must be made in honor of Christ's Sacred Heart, meaning, practicing devotion and having great love of His Sacred Heart. They must be on the first Friday of the month for nine consecutive months, and Holy Communion must be received. If one were to start on a First Friday and not keep the others then one would have to start over. Many great sacrifices must be made in order to obtain this final promise but the grace when receiving Holy Communion on First Friday's in indescribable!



### How to Go to Confession

Reconciliation may be face to face or anonymous, with a screen between you and the priest. Choose the option that is the most comfortable for you.

- The priest gives you a blessing or greeting. He may share a brief Scripture passage.
- Make the Sign of the Cross and say: "Bless me father, for I have sinned. My last confession was (give the number of weeks, months or years).
- Confess all of your sins to the priest. The priest will help you to make a good confession. If you are unsure about how to confess or you feel uneasy, just ask him to help you. Answer his questions without hiding anything out of fear or shame. Place your trust in God, a merciful Father who wants to forgive you.
- Following your confession of sins, say, "I am sorry for these and all of my sins."
- The priest assigns you a penance and offers advice to help you be a better Catholic.
- Say an Act of Contrition, expressing your sorrow for your sins. The priest, acting in the person of Christ, then absolves you from your sins

### **Act of Contrition**

My God, I am sorry for my sins with all my heart. In choosing to do wrong and failing to do good, I have sinned against you whom I should love above all things. I firmly intend, with your help, to do penance, to sin no more, and to avoid whatever leads me to sin. Our Savior Jesus Christ suffered and died for us. In his name, my God, have mercy.
