

FROM THE ARCHIVES: ST. COLUMBA WINDOW

Between 1912 and 1918 Msgr. Gerald J. McShane and artist Alexander S. Locke exchanged letters concerning the design and installation of the ten stained glass windows that presently line the nave of St. Patrick's Basilica. Together McShane and Locke selected and utilized ornamental decoration and detailed imagery to create windows that reveal interesting information about the lives of saints. Through McShane and Locke's letters we can learn interesting points about the Basilica's St. Columba window.

The St. Columba window is the third window, located to the right of the Basilica's sanctuary. The upper portion of the window depicts St. Columba stepping on a crown. This detail helps viewers remember that St. Columba relinquished his succession to the Clan of O'Donnell in order to pursue missionary work. The armorial of O'Donnell can be seen in the center of the window. The lower portion of the window depicts a scene from the saint's life. Viewers can see St. Columba in a boat leaving the shores of Ireland in the company of other monks. This scene depicts St. Columba's voyage to Iona in 563. On the island of Iona the saint founded a famous medieval monastery.

The St. Columba window is framed by geometrical and decorative forms that align with the French Neo-Gothic architectural features of St. Patrick's Basilica.

Please take the time to view St. Patrick's Basilica's stained-glass windows and enjoy the beautiful use of colour, ornamentation and symbolism.



History of St. Patrick's Basilica

St. Patrick's Church was opened on March 17th, 1847 to serve the needs of the Irish immigrants who had come to Montreal in great numbers due to the famine and other troubles in Ireland. The church was built in the Gothic Revival style on a promontory overlooking the City of Montreal. Its spire could be seen by all. Over the years the city grew north, east and west with the result that the church is now surrounded by modern-day Montreal. St. Patrick's Church was raised to the status of Minor Basilica by His Holiness, Pope John-Paul II in 1989 because of its historical importance as the mother church of the English-speaking Catholics of greater Montreal. The Basilica has been designated a Historical Monument by the Government of Quebec and as a National Historic Site by the Government of Canada.
