"Forgiveness is a choice. It happens in an instant. Reconciliation is a journey. It may take you the rest of your life. But forgiveness must come first." —Jacob, Everything is Wonderful

There is something awe-inspiring about the Amish's ability to "speak, forgive, and forget." It's a kind of mercy that I cannot fathom. It's a special kind of person who can offer unconditional forgiveness. I am not this kind of person. I regrettably admit that I'm inclined to hold grudges; I value loyalty above most things, and betrayal is not something I easily forget.

The Amish, however, believe in moving forward. Whether in grief, anger, bitterness, or pain, they are not a people who sit long in their emotions. Their faith has taught them this. Sulking infringes upon their ability to do their work. It infringes upon their relationship with God. Of course, the problem with this concept is that we all process emotions differently. If one is not allowed to experience their emotions fully and at their own pace then a path forward is not so easily accessible.

When I first read this play, I was struck by the betrayal that Miri feels. She feels betrayed by her family, her friend, and by God. Because of this, she's never felt more alone in her life. In rehearsal, I discovered that it's not just Miri who feels betrayed by God—it's every single character. To be betrayed by something so essential to your way of life is painful and undoubtedly disorienting. This pain weighs heavy on these characters. It's a pain they have tried desperately to overcome, often through distraction or denial, making unconditional forgiveness as elusive as ever. If you don't acknowledge the pain you're feeling or the pain that you've caused someone else, there is no path to forgiveness. There is no path forward.

Throughout rehearsal—thanks to the brilliant work of my actors—I realized that even with such betrayal, there is still so much love in this play. There is profound, aching, sometimes misguided, yet genuine love expressed in this play. This love does not excuse the betrayal or the pain, but it remains ever-present, bubbling to the surface in moments of tenderness, bursting forth through laughter and innocence, or disguising itself as a hard-learned lesson. It's in these moments of love that a path towards forgiveness truly reveals itself. It's in these moments that I see the presence of God.

Directing this play in a time when our culture is deeply engaged in an important conversation about the ways in which we acknowledge and support sexual assault survivors has been an impactful experience. It's stirred me to ask how—in a community of pacifists—someone who has experienced unimaginable tragedy can move forward? In a community of faith, how can someone who has experienced betrayal surrender themselves to the will of God? How can someone heal if their pain isn't given the validity it deserves?

Thank you for choosing to spend your time at WaterTower Theatre. I'm so proud of the work my actors and designers have poured into this production and I sincerely hope you enjoy the play.

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


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
