What a time we had. Wow!

Participants arrived with their personal treasures and stories of items to be appraised at the 2nd Annual Coronado Treasures Roadshow held October 10th.

One such family treasure was brought in by Susan Keith. She arrived with a chair given to her by her father, Vice Admiral Stanhope Cotton Ring. He served in Washington D.C. as aide to the Chief of the Bureau of Aeronautics, Rear Admiral William A. Moffett, then served as President Herbert Hoover's naval aide. The chair was a gift to the Vice Admiral from the Blair family. Later the Blair family home became Blair House, the official government guest home for the White House. The chair is still adorned with the original leather, walnut frame and handforged screws.

For the Keith family, sitting in the chair evokes a special reverence and emotion, knowing that President Lincoln once sat in it. "Sometimes it gives me the willies to sit in it, knowing its history," Keith said. The chair was appraised with significant value, but the real worth is in sharing it with family and friends. "All my grandchildren enjoy sitting in the chair- it is special to all of us."

The most spectacular item of the day was a hand inscribed presentation sword, also passed down through generations. The sword was given to a lieutenant

A Shining Moment this December!

A RATHER MOMENTOUS MILESTONE IS OCCURRING THIS DECEMBER--ONE YOU DON'T WANT TO MISS.

Coronado's December focus will be the formal celebration of the city's 125th anniversary and the Mayor's Dinner event scheduled for December 11th at the Hotel del Coronado.

That is also the day that CHA unveils its most important project of the year, the release of a newly remastered 4th Edition of the preeminent work of Coronado history — *Coronado: The Enchanted Island!*

"Remastered" is an understatement. It's been 17 years since a fresh edition of *Enchanted Island* was released.

The 4th Edition features a ton of new research into Coronado history, a reformatted, easy-to-read size and font, many fresh and exciting images drawn from our archives, and inclusion of a first-ever "Coronado Almanac." In addition, we worked hard to correct the occasional factual inaccuracies from previous editions that have been reported by both the CHA staff and folks in town.

With all these improvements, we have been very careful to maintain the tone and flow of the original authors (Katherine Eitzen Carlin and historian Dr. Ray Brandes). We added material from new research, or information not available to the first authors. We have clearly indicated these additions through the use of subtle background shading in the flow of text.

It's been said that Coronado has more history per square inch than any other community in San Diego County. But history, indeed, never sleeps. So, the story of Coronado has now been updated and expanded through this, its most recent and most impressive version.



We think that the 4th Edition is a Coronado collectable all by itself, but we are going to reinforce that standing by releasing a special limited edition of this volume on December 11th. In commemoration of the city's 125th, this limited edition will be a hard-cover-book, restricted to only 125 signed and numbered copies, and sold for \$125.

We plan to open pre-sales of the 4th Edition Limited Edition on November 11th, through both the CHA website and our Museum Store, and the book will be available in time for Christmas. We plan to release a soft-cover and eBook version of the 4th Edition sometime in 2016.

We are deeply indebted to the sincere generosity of those who responded to our Annual Appeal a year ago that helped set us on the path to develop this breakthrough volume. More than anything, a 4th Edition is proof of the depth and complexity of the Coronado story, and of its boundless fascination for readers across so many years.

Coronado is a community rich in heritage, community pride, and small town atmosphere and equally rich in promise for the future. Our inspiring future, as we all know, is directly built upon the firm foundation of the community's past.

We think our fresh new account of Coronado's treasured past is an important addition to the historical record, and will earn a place on every Coronadan's bookshelf.

With the San Diego-Coronado Bridge as a backdrop, guests meandered throughout Coronado Art Walk while enjoying blue skies above and maritime activities on San Diego Bay.

Many of the artists traveled long distances to participate is this juried show. Carol and Stelios Paraskevas traveled from Connecticut to Coronado. The last six years they have come to display their wearable art pieces. They first attended the show as visitors then decided to participate as artists. For organizers the decision to include them in the show was an easy one. Stelios Art is sold through the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York, the British Museum in London, and the Smithsonian Institution in Washington D.C. resulted in his award of the Medal of Honor.

The exhibit also honors Admiral Stockdale's wife, Sybil. She raised the family's four sons in Coronado during Stockdale's long captivity and fought tirelessly to bring worldwide attention to bear on the plight of POWs who were surviving terrible torture in Vietnam. She later became the recipient of the Navy Distinguished Public Service Award, the highest award given by the Department of the Navy to a citizen not employed by the Department. She is the only wife of an active-duty officer to receive this award.

The entire Coronado Museum exhibit has been fully supported and endorsed by the Stockdale family who loaned many of the display items so that the public could become fully immersed in the details of this extraordinary saga. Important elements of the exhibit at the Coronado Museum were once highly classified.

The Stockdale exhibit at the Coronado Museum was opened at a private, invitation-only reception on September 17th for Coronado Historical Association members and invited guests



Sybil Stockdale attended this reception with her sons, Jim, Sid, and Taylor as well as their families. Six surviving POWs were also in attendance, several with their wives who had been active members of Sybil's National League of Families of American Prisoners Missing in Southeast Asia. Sherry Martin, wife of recently deceased former-POW Vice Admiral Ed Martin, received a rousing round of applause.

A surprise attendee at the museum's opening reception was Ross Perot and his wife Margot. Perot was an independent presidential candidate in 1992, with Admiral Stockdale as his running mate. Perot has always been an inspiring supporter of American POWs, and spoke to the guests at the reception.

The Coronado Museum also offers a parallel story to Admiral Stockdale's Medal of Honor, with a display featuring Coronado's very first Medal of Honor recipient, Willy Cronan who was awarded his Medal of Honor in 1908 for courageously saving shipmates from the Navy's steel gunboat Bennington that sank in

San Diego Bay from a boiler explosion. Cronan Park is located on Pomona Avenue in Coronado. These two "Coronado" Medals of Honor sit next to one another in the exhibit.

The Coronado Museum is the first museum to tell the exhilarating story of the Stockdale family, an exhibit that is destined for showing at other locales throughout the country.

Children can experience the exhibit by engaging in a scavenger hunt, ask for it at the information desk at the entrance to the museum. In addition to the Stockdale exhibit, attendees can enjoy The Enchanted Island Gallery and the Hotel Del & Tent City Gallery of the Coronado Museum.


The archivist, collections staff and volunteers took immense pleasure researching and producing the expansive exhibit and are glad that all that great work won't be lost.

Focus on the Archive

As with most museums,
Coronado Historical has a
Collections Committee that
determines what items should be
accepted into the museum collection. In
July, an amazing number of stories and
accompanying artifacts were accepted
into the archives.

One close to my heart is an archival piece of wood measuring no more than 3 inches wide and 12 inches long; a piece of the flight deck from the *USS Saratoga*! Generously donated by Susan Keith, the piece of wood has significant ephemera detailing the crew's affection for 'Sara', the nickname the crew affectionately called her.

As a recent transplant from the National Museum of the Marine Corps and an Army brat, the military is a large part of my life. While interning with the United States Marine Corps History Division, I conducted hours of research for the



Marine Aviation Centennial in 2012. I combed through numerous resources in preparation of a paper highlighting the history of the transition of battle cruisers to aircraft carriers. So you can imagine my shock and joy when Susan Keith carried a piece of 'Sara' through our doors. There in my hands was a piece of one of the very first aircraft carriers commissioned in the United States Navy.

The US Navy originally intended to build a battle cruiser when the keel of the *USS Saratoga* was laid down in 1920. However the Washington Naval Treaty of 1922 limited the armament of national navies. As a result, the US Navy transitioned both the *USS Saratoga* and the *USS Lexington* from battle cruisers to aircraft carriers.

Commissioned November 16, 1927, the *USS Saratoga* was a masterpiece alongside her sister ship, the USS Lexington. With


an 874 foot wooden flight deck, over 111 feet wide, the *USS Saratoga* (CV-3), easily accommodated 83 aircraft.

For ten years, the *USS Saratoga* called San Diego Bay her home. She demonstrated vulnerabilities of Pearl Harbor as a military hub during Fleet Problem XIX, three years before the bombing of Pearl Harbor. She survived the Battle of the Solomon Islands and provided air cover during Tarawa in World War II. In 1946, the *USS Saratoga* participated in Operation Crossroads, where atomic bomb testing sunk her off the coast of the Bikini Atoll on July 25, 1946.

This small portion of the massive flight deck provides a window into the vast history that the *USS Saratoga* can tell.

for his service in the war of 1812, while serving aboard *USS Constitution*. Never to be used for battle, the sword is unique in every way; including a hard-engraved photo of 'Old Ironsides' and a handle of gold.

The *USS Constitution*, named by President George Washington is most famous for her actions during the War of 1812. The battle with *HMS* frigate *Guerriere* in 1812 earned her the nickname of "Old Ironsides".

Incredibly the Coronado Treasures Roadshow appraiser valued the sword at nearly a quarter of a million dollars due to it's historical significance.


