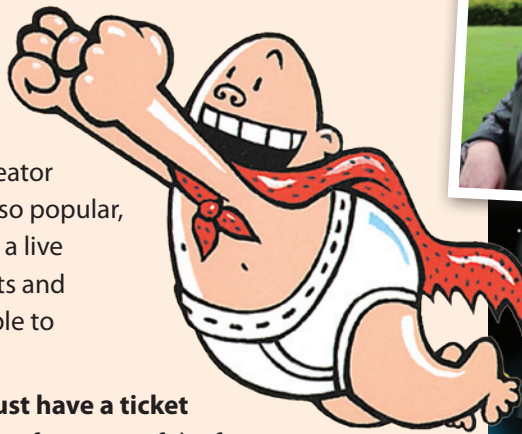

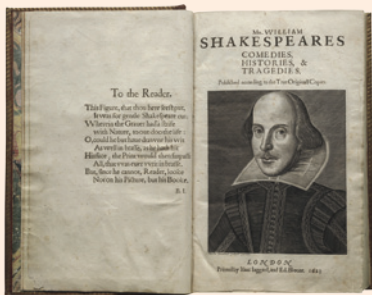

In celebration of the 400th anniversary of Shakespeare's 1616 death, the Folger Shakespeare Library in Washington, D.C. has arranged the ultimate book tour. *First Folio! The Book that Gave Us Shakespeare* is stopping in each state

for a limited time. Without the Folio, we would very likely have only half of Shakespeare's works—it contains 36 plays and one of only two likenesses of Shakespeare considered "authentic." Shakespeare's First Folio will be in Boise August 20-September 21, hosted by Boise State University.
