We Are Family! Orlando López Plants Hispanic Fellowship at First Pres

Wanting to cross cultural barriers to bring the gospel to our community, Orlando López has been hired to start a Hispanic Fellowship at First Pres.

Even before coming on staff, Orlando has been a friend of First Pres for a couple of years now. While pastoring at a local church, Orlando was introduced to Murray Gossett. Orlando remembers, "We met for lunch one afternoon, probably at Subway, and it was the start of a friendship in ministry and in life."

In June of 2011, Orlando felt his time at his previous church was coming to a close. He started to pray about the next step. He confided in his friend Murray of his feelings and asked Murray to pray with him. The very next day, Orlando received a phone call from Howard Griffin asking if Orlando would meet with him. As Orlando spoke with Howard, he heard a heart that desired to reach the Hispanic community, a heart that wanted to build the kingdom of God. Howard began to speak with Orlando about starting a Hispanic fellowship at First Pres. Once Orlando prayed about the decision and agreed to come on board, every step seemed to fall into place. "I saw God in every step; it couldn't have happened any other way."

As for the plans to start the fellowship meetings, Orlando would like to strictly connect and build relationships with members at First Pres over the next couple of months. Right now, the target date to begin fellowship meetings is Sunday, March 18th, right after Spring Break. The details of what that service will look like are still being planned, but prayer meetings and home bible studies are included at the top of the list. The contemporay service will be bi-lingual - spoken half in English and half in Spanish. His vision for the fellowship is:

- A warm, welcoming church
- A multi-generational church
- A relationship-oriented church
- A reproducing church

Already taking the opportunity to reach out to hispanics in our community, Orlando has become the First Pres representative with Snack Pak 4 Kids. Snack Pak 4 Kids is a local organization that provides food to children who are not able to eat on the weekends because their parents cannot afford to buy food. Through monies from the Refurbishing Campaign, First Pres adopted "Snack Pak-ers" at Sunrise Elementary. Because of your giving, 64 kids will not have to worry about what they are going eat on the weekends. Here's what's inside a snack pak:

On the Wednesday before the sale, First Pres member, Laird Kinnier, and a friend of his took everything to CLC - mountains of stuff! On Wednesday, Thursday and Friday nights, First Pres and CLC members worked very hard organizing, sorting and displaying everything. On Friday night, families involved in the Navigator-Neighbor program were invited to come and 'pre-shop.' Four of our Neighbors attended.



The sale was scheduled from 10:00 a.m. until noon. By 9:30, there were many people gathered in the parking lot, so we opened the doors. All of the toys, games and kitchen items went immediately. Infant and children's clothes were also very popular. We had a storage trailer that had been delivered to CLC earlier that was completely full. Nothing had been taken out of it. At 10:45, we announced that shoppers could go outside to shop. By 11:30, everything was gone! It's estimated that there were approximately 250 large yard bags filled with merchandise.

The Downtown Women's Center came and picked up all of the remaining items the following week - another 50 bags or so! Everything was put to good use.



Everyone has read the story of Christ feeding 5,000 people, starting with only five loaves and two fish. Not only did He feed everyone, but He had twelve baskets left over! The Free Garage Sale was much the same. It seemed that the merchandise was multiplying! No matter how much was taken out, there was an abundance to go around for everyone who came.
