






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EIT Joint Innovation Incubator Program

1. Background

The project aims at enhancing the innovation capacities of RIS regions by establishing individual concepts for regional ecosystem effective university-based incubators based on joint knowledge transfer and individual concept development.

Although universities and incubators often have access to local and regional ecosystems, the desired impact for them as local and regional innovation incubators remain low, and their impact to the surrounding ecosystems remain limited in most cases. With the right concept and appropriate support from all relevant stakeholders (including the multiple EIT KICs) universities can play an important hub and multiplier function as innovation centres. Since there is no one-for-all "right" concept for building up a successful university incubator, but in individual activities we see many good examples; through a common work, discussion and knowledge transfer process, the most promising concept for each individual case can be developed and implemented.

Thus, the Joint Innovation Incubator activity will aim on two things in parallel:

- jointly building the "right" particular concepts for ecosystem effective incubators, based on joint knowledge transfer and individual concept development together with the focused local ecosystems, that will enhance the innovation capacity of the effected regions;
- (ii) transferring KIC good practises of the Knowledge Triangle Integration around the innovation incubators from the concept phase on, thus making the ecosystems, which eventually should benefit from the innovation incubator, an integral part of it.

Beneficiaries of the project are universities from the EIT's RIS region¹ with existing incubators, which cover at least 2-3 different KIC's thematic scope. To ensure success, prior unconditional commitment from the Rectorates of the participating universities and the active participation of relevant representatives are/were required. Participating Universities need/ed to raise national co-funding and to run the parallel related workshop activities within their particular ecosystem on their own.

Program:

The project started in 2020 with a one-year concept phase, followed by a one-year implementation period in 2021. The concepts developed in 2020 will be initiated, optimized and sustainably implemented in a subsequent second phase (implementation phase, 12 months, in 2021), with the

EIT KICs wanting to participate according to their strategies. The final outcome of the project will consist in tested and finally reviewed individual incubation concepts and processes linking with all key players of the regional/local innovation ecosystems, thus enabling the acceleration of innovation via the Knowledge Triangle Integration and supporting the creation of conditions where innovation is more likely to thrive and generate breakthroughs.

2. How is the program structured?

The project started in 2020 with a one-year concept phase, followed by a one-year implementation period in 2021. The concepts developed in 2020 by each participating university will be initiated, optimized and sustainably implemented in a subsequent second phase (implementation phase, 12 months, in 2021), with the EIT KICs wanting to participate according to their strategies. Intended outcome will be the implementation of the concepts developed in year 1 in the frame of pilot projects. The final outcome of the project will consist in tested and finally reviewed individual incubation concepts and processes linking with all key players of the regional/local innovation ecosystems, thus enabling the acceleration of innovation via the Knowledge Triangle Integration and supporting the creation of conditions where innovation is more likely to thrive and generate breakthroughs.

Year one (2020) was dedicated to capacity building, knowledge exchange and concept development. During year one selected incubators have worked through moderated workshops on the development of their own sustainable business incubation model according to their individual work plan. 6 such workshops have been held during which KICs presented cases and best practices from their networks, also international best practices have been examined.

Year two (2021) will focus on implementing the strategies and concepts developed in year one. The individual business plans drawn up by the participating incubators are to be implemented and initial collaborations with interested KICs are to be established. At the same time, the mutual learning and the best practice exchange between the participating incubators and the participating KICs should continue along with the implementation of the business plans. For this purpose, workshops will take place in the incubators – ideally in connection with corresponding events and / or activities taking place there – at which the successes and difficulties will be evaluated and learnings as well as mitigation measures should be determined. This contains in particular:

- Implementation of processes based on new incubator concepts
- Implementation of enhanced strategy for acquiring start-ups
- Implementation of a 12 months pilot project

- Development and implementation of a long-term strategy
- Development and implementation of external networking processes
- Conception of a thorough communication and awareness strategy

3. Who can participate?

The participation is open to any university operating in a country considered as RIS country member of the European Union (countries included are Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Estonia, Greece, Hungary, Southern Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Malta, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovakia, Slovenia, and Spain) that are not (yet) partners of EIT Urban Mobility. Universities must have a proven connection to sustainable urban mobility and its briefly described and demonstrated during the application².

4. What EIT Urban Mobility provides and expects?

In case of selection and invitation, the participating university shall:

- Participate in an introductory event. The selected university joins to an ongoing program started in 2020, therefore a 1-day online intro activity is prepared where the participation is obligatory. During the intro event, materials from 2020 will be presented and made available, expectations communicated.
- Based on the intro event an annual activity plan to develop an implement including participating the 6 workshop provided and organized to all participating universities within the program o the following topics:
 - further engagement and activities with the local innovation ecosystem
 - exchange of knowledge, how to apply for funding and take part in projects in the domains of EIT
 - how to be well prepared to respond to calls of the EU recovery fund and in the framework of the 2021-2027 period of Structural Funds
 - the funding potential may also raise the opportunity of joint applications of the participating universities and the EIT KIC units involved in this project

- at least one local event organized on building and integrating local ecosystem (event can be connected to a similar or relevant event the university organizing independently from this program) with the effort to involve also some of the other participating university from the program, participating,
- participating a observer in any of the Jumpstarter³ training event;
- participating in a meeting organized physically at one of the well-established university incubator in Europe⁴
- actively cooperating with the KICs and participating universities and develop a long-term plan on how to improve your incubator on a long run (this shall be a short report)

What EIT Urban Mobility provides:

• Max 5000 EUR funding for the activity, organizing the physical meeting in Q3-Q4 2021, the 6 workshop with the facilitation of outstanding experts and facilitating your networking and development process.

5. How to apply?

To participate in the Joint Incubator Program, the applicants must fill in the attached application form and submit it via email at: imre.gombkoto@eiturbanmobility.eu

The deadline for submission of the proposal is 15 March 2021 17:00pm CET.

Only applications submitted in English will be accepted; applications submitted in other languages will not be considered. The program implementation will be also in English.

6. How is the financial support distributed?

In case of selection, the respective Universities will be invited to sign a Sub-Grant Agreement (SGA with EIT Urban Mobility) based on the activity plan described in section 4.1. A signed SGA is a criterion for receiving any financial support from EIT Urban mobility.

The selected university invited to implement their action plan can define the activities in line with the program requirements up to 5.000 EUR grant for 2021 however co-funding of activities is also expected including the possibility of in-kind contribution. All activity and related costs shall be done and incurred in 2021 calendar year. The funding is subject to EIT approval and is dependent on the successful delivery and reporting of the activity.

7. How are applications evaluated?

The evaluation of applications shall be carried out by EIT Urban Mobility. The applications will be evaluated based on the university's demonstrated link to the mobility sector either through education or research, the potential to increase capacity for business incubation, and the university's potential to successfully integrate in the local ecosystem within a mid-term timeframe.
