- Ensure there is a clear progression from *Cambridge English:* Young Learners to Cambridge English exams for secondary schools and beyond.








Combridge English: Young Learners tests are produced by Cambridge English Language Assessment, part of the University of Cambridge. They are designed to help children achieve internationally recognised standards of English. There are three levels – Starters, Movers and Flyers – linked to the Council of Europe's Common European Framework of Reference for Languages at Levels A1 and A2.

Results for Cambridge Young Learner exams are also aligned to the Cambridge English Scale (CES). The CES is designed to complement the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) and allows for more straightforward results reporting across our exams and better meets the needs of our exam users.
