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

Principal's Report



Happy NAIDOC Week!

It is a shame that we can't get together this year across our school community to celebrate and learn about Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander culture and history. We are very excited that our students will be undertaking activities throughout the week in their classes but particularly on Wednesday.

Below is some great reading from the NAIDOC WEEK 2020 website explaining Always Was, Always Will Be.

"Always Was, Always Will Be. recognises that First Nations people have occupied and cared for this continent for over 65,000 years.

We are spiritually and culturally connected to this country.

This country was criss-crossed by generations of brilliant Nations.

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people were Australia's first explorers, first navigators, first engineers, first farmers, first botanists, first scientists, first diplomats, first astronomers and first artists.

Australia has the world's oldest oral stories. The First Peoples engraved the world's first maps, made the earliest paintings of ceremony and invented unique technologies. We built and engineered structures - structures on Earth - predating well-known sites such as the Egyptian Pyramids and Stonehenge.

Our adaptation and intimate knowledge of Country enabled us to endure climate change, catastrophic droughts and rising sea levels.

Always Was, Always Will Be. acknowledges that hundreds of Nations and our cultures covered this continent. All were managing the land - the biggest estate on earth - to sustainably provide for their future.

Through ingenious land management systems like fire stick farming we transformed the harshest habitable continent into a land of bounty.

NAIDOC Week 2020 acknowledges and celebrates that our nation's story didn't begin with documented European contact whether in 1770 or 1606 - with the arrival of the Dutch on the western coast of the Cape York Peninsula.

The very first footprints on this continent were those belonging to First Nations peoples.

Our coastal Nations watched and interacted with at least 36 contacts made by Europeans prior to 1770. Many of them resulting in the charting of the northern, western and southern coastlines - of our lands and our waters.

For us, this nation's story began at the dawn of time.

NAIDOC 2020 invites all Australians to embrace the true history of this country - a history which dates back thousands of generations.

It's about seeing, hearing and learning the First Nations' 65,000+ year history of this country - which is Australian history. We want all Australians to celebrate that we have the oldest continuing cultures on the planet and to recognise that our sovereignty was never ceded.

LATEST COVID-19 INFORMATION

All adults must maintain a minimum of 1.5 metres physical distancing.

From November 12, P&C meetings can proceed on school sites after hours. Therefore our P&C AGM will occur on Tuesday November 24 at 7pm.

Non-essential adults are not permitted on school grounds or at school events.

We are looking to our plans for our Presentation Assembly and Kindergarten Orientation Activities although there hasn't been much change in the guidelines and the measures that need to be adhered to make it often too difficult to implement. We will keep you updated.

We have had some questions concerning bringing in food on birthdays. The only option is for pre-packaged single serve portions. There is still no possibility around sharing or self-serving with food.

A reminder that no student is permitted to attend school with even the most mild flu-like symptoms. The school is required to send home any students displaying flu-like symptoms from our school sick bay. Please be reminded that if students are sent home from school with flu-like symptoms they are required to have a COVID-19 test, show the school a copy of the negative result and can then return to school once they have had three symptoms free days. These are the guidelines from NSW Health, the NSW Government and the Department of Education. Thanks so much for your support of these guidelines. Whilst we understand the difficulty this can place on parents, please continue to understand and respect the decisions made by our teachers and office staff. By adhering to these rules we are actually experiencing some of the healthiest attendance by our students at school as many of the common illnesses that perhaps we would make our children soldier on with are not being spread across our students.

MORNINGS

We are experiencing high numbers of students arriving at school early. Whilst we understand that sometimes you might arrive a few minutes early, it is expected that no child is on site until after 8.40am when school supervision commences. Parents have the capacity to engage the services of Camp Australia or Rainbow Cottage if they have a need for their children to be cared for prior to 8.40am. If your child walks to school can you please change the time they are leaving home if they are arriving at school early. Thanks for your support with this as we need to ensure the safety of our students at all times.

- Children who live in NSW.

If, however, you do not feel comfortable completing an application online, a paper copy will be available for collection from the front office or can be downloaded from the Department's going to a public school site.

If you already have a child attending our school and are no longer considered to live within our local school area, you will be required to fill out an application for non-local enrolment.

The collection box is now approximately half full and getting quite heavy.


