# Scholarship Students

- Full Tuition
- \$250 per month living allowance during school year
  - \$50 increase each year
- □ \$375 per semester for books
- Initial Issue Uniforms
- □ Paid summer training (3-4 weeks)
- Vanderbilt University Scholarship Midshipmen only: Scholarship recipients in good standing are eligible to receive up to \$6000 per year for room/board



# Program Benefits



- College Program (non-scholarship)
  - □ Required uniforms, NROTC books, tutoring
  - All activities similar to scholarship students
  - Opportunity for scholarships, or Advanced Standing
- College Program (Advanced Standing)
  - Apply in spring of Sophomore year
  - □ \$350 per month during school year
  - □ \$375 per semester for books
  - Uniforms
  - Paid summer training





- Scholarship benefits (i.e. tuition) will not start/activate until "successfully" completed by 45<sup>th</sup> day of classes.
  - □ If DODMERB physical not completed by 6 OCT 2018, student must pay the Fall 2018 tuition/fees immediately to school.
  - □ If "successfully" completed after 6 OCT 18, the government, with approval from higher authority, may back-pay the school.
    - Must pay school personal reimbursement is not authorized.

so help me God."






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
