

Grade 10 Students

- 1. Have students visit www.myBlueprint.ca, and enter their email and password to log in.
- 2. **Forgotten password?** Students can reset their passwords by clicking on the 'Forgot your password?' link in the green Existing User box.
- 3. Students link their account to their advisory teacher, their counsellor by alpha, and Ms. MacPherson (Click your picture/name in the top right corner \rightarrow settings \rightarrow account settings \rightarrow my links \rightarrow add teachers & counsellors)
