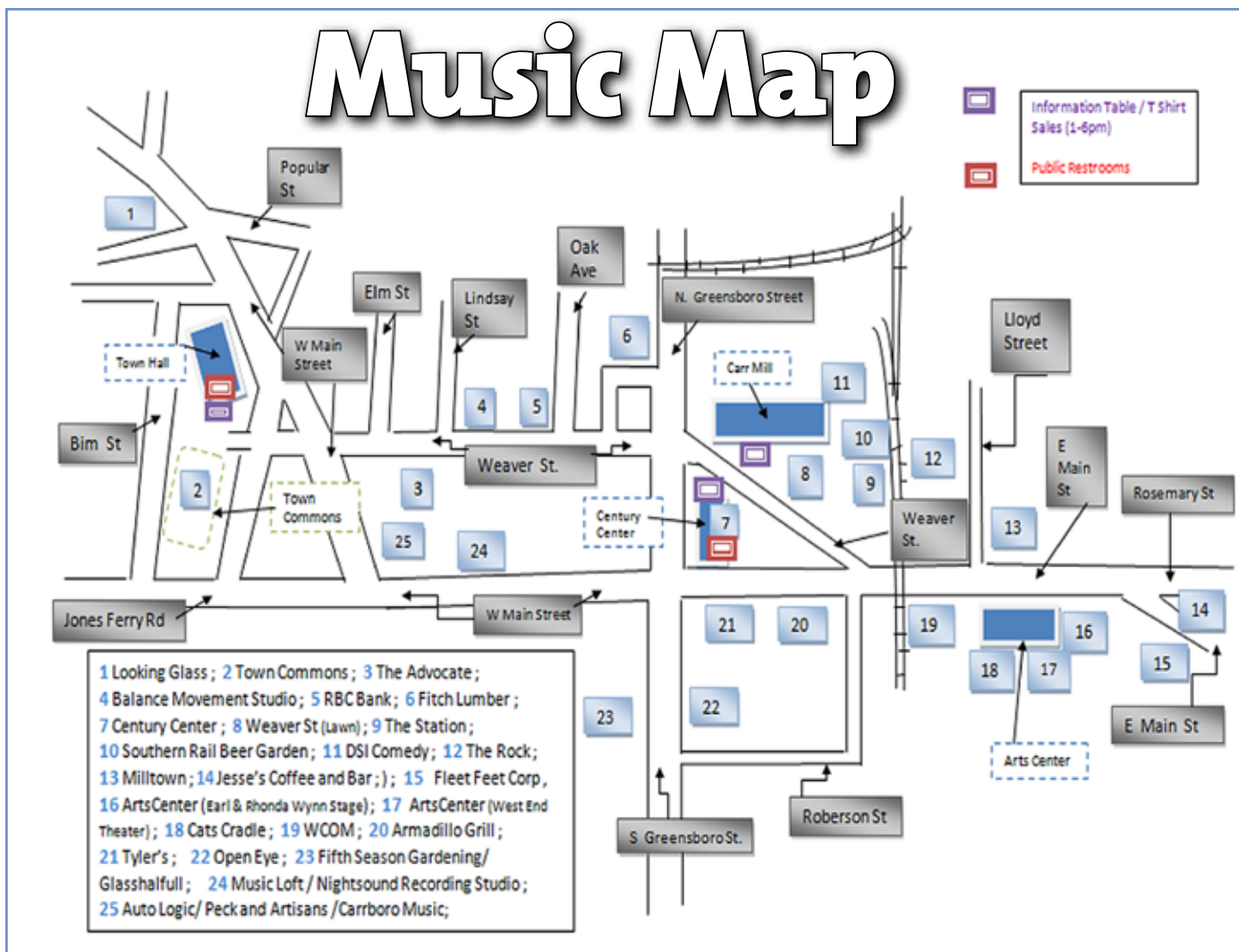

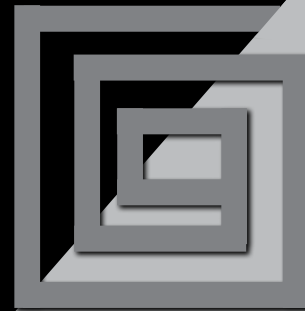

Foul-Weather Plan

Eleven of the 25 venues are inside, so activities at those will continue rain or shine. In the case of a possible day-long rain, the festival committee and the police and public works will make a decision concerning the viability of the outside venues. That decision will be made well before 10 a.m. on event day. The only real possibilities for moving an outdoor venue inside are Weaver Street Market moving into rooms 2/3 in the Century Center, the Looking Glass Café moving inside and the Town Commons site moving into the Town Hall boardroom. Performances at other outdoor venues will most likely be canceled. If changes occur to the current performance schedule, they will be announced on the Carrboro Recreation and Parks Department weather line, 918-7373.
