Spain 1934. Diego Padilla, champion of chess, meets the French journalist Marianne Latour. The Spanish civil war is about to blow up and it is in this agitated context that they fall in love. They have a daughter and they would live in Madrid until the violence and misery push them into exile to an occupied France. There the game will take another course: Diego will face an accusation of espionage by the Nazis and will suffer a brutal imprisonment.

Written in first person, *El jugador de ajedrez* is a heart-rending account of the epiphany of love in times of devastation and moral misery which ruined the dreams of a good man: a stoic loser who for love waived betrayal and postponed revenge. Perhaps the eternal fight between whites against blacks ended being the melancholic refuge against the memory of a champion demolished by definitive sadness. Chess was his life, but his life was not only chess.

Written with the prodigious simplicity of the best prose writers, in this fascinating novel the reader is faced with cruelty, but also compassion and friendship, which reveal the double substance of the human condition, capable of plotting the sublime and its sinister reverse side. If in *Apología de Venus* Julio Castedo delighted with the deepness of his vision, in *El jugador de ajedrez* he reveals as a master in the art of storytelling which is an axe blow on the conscience. You are not the same person when you have finished one of his novels.





An intelligent thriller about Leon Trotsky and his stopwatch, an instrument for the implementation of world equality. It is also about the beauty of architecture, and about the exceptional love of a man for two women as he searches for a new truth concerning the life of Trotsky.

Mexico City, autumn 2004. A Nordic filmmaker arrives in the city to make a documentary film about Casa Estudio, a house designed by Mexican architect Luis Barragán. It will be the last in a series of five films on works by the most remarkable architects in the modern era on different continents: Le Corbusier, Tadao Ando, Konstantin Melnikov, Alvar Aalto, Luis Barragán. While filming, he meets Veronica Díaz, a Mexican photographer who introduces him to her grandfather, Emilio del Franco, a watchmaker whose brother was Trotsky's closest bodyguard on the day the ex-communist leader was assassinated in his home in Coyoacán in 1940. The filmmaker learns that the watchmaker's brother stole an envelope from Trotsky's desk while the badly injured philosopher was being rushed to hospital, where he later died, and in the envelope was a document, which the watchmaker now has. This document contains the code for an unusual stopwatch that works by means of ultra- and infrasound, devised by Trotsky's secret Time League in Moscow in the 20's. The stopwatch can paralyze all living things within a certain radius for 60 seconds. And during that minute of silence, the full equality of all people will be achieved and Trotsky's utopian dream of universal brotherhood and communism will come true, metaphorically and momentarily. Thus begins the filmmaker's journey, sometimes alone and sometimes with Veronica Díaz, from Mexico to Russia, Turkey, France and Germany to discover the previously unknown facets and philosophy of Leon Trotsky, the most mistreated political figure of the 20th century. He learns that, contrary to what history would have us believe, it was not only politics but envy of the magic stopwatch that compelled Stalin to assassinate Trotsky. The adventure comes to a head at the moment when the stopwatch is activated on the largest city square in the world, Zocalo Plaza in Mexico City, and has the exact effect that Leon Trotsky and his Time League had planned. This causes global chaos as the world media believes that all consumer culture will now end forever.

A work of both political and philosophical science-fiction, *Leon Trotsky's Stopwatch* is about our blindness to new perspectives on recent history. It is also an appreciation of the design of some of the most exquisite private houses in the world, and the tremendous love story of a Nordic filmmaker, his Flemish wife, and a woman from Mexico, in an age when changes in human culture and the human environment are making the modern concept of time lose its meaning and humanity is slowly but inevitably losing any possibility of continuing its destructive way of life on this lonely, rocky planet.

Rax Rinnekangas (b.1954) is a Finnish multi-artist; author, filmmaker and photographer. He has published over 25 works: novels, short stories, poems, essays and books on photography. He has made several art films about visual arts and architecture and has held near 50 private exhibitions in many countries (Museo Nacional Centro de Arte Reina Sofia, Madrid, 2003; La Tabacalera – Centro Internacional de Cultura Contemporanéa, San Sebastían, 2005; El Centro de La Imagen, Mexíco D.F. 2007). 
