1st Sunday of Advent—November 28, 2021

From the desk of Father Charles:

According to present usage, Advent is a period beginning with the Sunday nearest to the feast of St. Andrew the Apostle (30 November) and embracing four Sundays. The first Sunday may be as early as 27th November, or as late as 3rd December, and then Advent has twenty-eight days, or twenty-one days respectively. In the Western churches (Latin rite), the liturgical year begins with the advent.

It is very uncertain when the celebration of advent started in the history of the Church. However, there has been a record that it was observed in the Spain in the 7th century (650 AD).

In the 12th century, black was the colour used during advent, but by the end of the 13th century, it was changed to violet which we use till now. Flowers are not to be placed in the sanctuary during this period, the use of organ or loud music is not so encouraged, except on the third Sunday when we are called to 'rejoice' for the coming of Christ is nearer (Gaudete Sunday).

During this time of Advent, in the Masses, the intention of the Church is shown in the choice of the Epistles and Gospels. We are admonished to prepare ourselves worthily to celebrate the anniversary of the Lord's coming into the world as the incarnate God of love, in order to make our souls and bodies fitting abodes for the Redeemer and Savior coming in Holy Communion and through grace, and also make ourselves ready for His final coming as judge, at death and at the end of the world.

From the desk of Deacon Gerard:

This Sunday marks the beginning of a new liturgical year and season. We are starting the year of the Gospel of Luke. God gives us a different grace in every liturgical season and God has a grace to give us this Advent. For some Advent is only a time of consumerism and buying gifts for people that they don't really want or need. In reality there is only one gift at Christmas that we actually need to receive, and that gift is Jesus! Jesus is the grace that the Father wants to give to us this Advent. Let us spend time with God to receive His grace.

To receive the grace that God offers us this Advent, as well as spending more time in prayer with God and putting God first, let us also reflect on whether our lives are modeled on the life of Jesus whose birth we are about to celebrate. Is Jesus the one we look to for guidance? Is Jesus the one who is shaping our life? To receive the grace God offers us this Advent an examination of conscience is necessary and that is why celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation is an important part of Advent. As we examine our consciences, we recognize that our lives do not always model or reflect Jesus and we want to ask for mercy so that our hearts can become a 'manger' to receive Jesus.

Nearing the end of December, we will hear a lot of talk of New Year resolutions. But I feel Advent, is the time for making a resolution, a resolution to live like Jesus whose birth we are about to celebrate. Jesus is the light of the world and Advent is a time to come out of the darkness and walk in the light of Jesus.

Rejoice in our Lord.

During the past month, in the Simcoe/Waterford/Delhi area, we gave a three day supply of groceries and \$2135.00 in food store gift cards, from our pantries, to 89 families, having a total of 235 adults and children. The Soup Kitchen provided nutritious take out meals, three days per week to some of God's needlest children. During the past month they served 1761 people which is an average of 88 per day of operation

The collection on the first Sunday of November was \$ 476.00 from Our Lady Queen of Martyrs, \$812.00 from St. Bernard's and \$1983.00 from St Mary's. We received a very large Halloween donation of food and funds from Holy Trinity Catholic High School. An individual donated a stand-up freezer to the Soup Kitchen, which is certainly appreciated, as it has been on our wish list for some time. We thank all those who have been generous with their contributions during the pandemic.

As previously advised, the long standing tradition of the giving tree in St. Mary's is not possible this year, because of Covid-19 restrictions. In the place of food items, our Christmas Hampers will include Food Basics and /or Sobeys gift cards for the recipients to buy their groceries and Giant Tiger or Wal-Mart gift cards for their personal gifts.
