





Parish Policy Reminder

Please submit all requests for bulletin announcements at least 2 weeks prior to your event. Publishing, printing, and shipping take time.

If you intend to use parish space for meetings, events or gatherings, please remember to request your desired time, date and space with the parish office staff ahead of time to avoid conflicts, and allow us proper cleaning time. This applies to all, as more activities resume after having been away for the past year and more. Don't assume your previous "standard" time still applies.

Today's bulletin comes by way of a request. Earlier this month, I asked my daily Mass folks to consider the final ten minutes before Mass to be "guiet time" for prayer and reflection before the start of Mass. I made that request because if I can't start Mass in a good frame of mind, I will not be able to fully enter into that day's worship... or lead others to worship, for that matter. Furthermore, if morning Mass is ruined or disrupted, it is exceedingly likely that my entire day will follow suit. I cannot remember the last time I had a good day with a bad Mass. Truly, I tell you now, much of my life depends upon the Eucharist, and celebrating Mass well does require a degree of effort and focus. For all these reasons, a few minutes of sacred silence prior to Mass is worth a great deal.

Of course, it's easy to get distracted when you first come into church. You see people you may not have seen for a week or two and there is new information on the bulletin board. Obviously, our phones remain nonstop temptations – even when on silent in our pockets.

So today, please hear me out and consider the value of a few minutes of focused silence before Mass. I'd like this to be an unwritten rule and/or personal goal for everyone at every Mass: Sunday as surely as Wednesday. The ultimate idea here is to allow as many people as possible to be mentally and spiritually prepared for the service. The ideal of that goal applies to every Mass, even if some Mass times are naturally going to be quieter than others. When I have a baptism family to take care of prior to Mass, or there are raffle tickets or other events going on, true silence is probably not achievable. Plus,


children are automatically noisy, and life is unpredictable. Some noise and distraction is going to happen whether we like it or not.

Nevertheless, this is a worthy communal goal for us to hold to, as long as it serves to improve the very reason we come to church in the first place.

Thank you for reading and may our future liturgies grow in sacredness and vitality!

P.S. To this end, I sketched up a little holiness-to-time graph. Ideally, that's the path our spirits ought to take during Mass, culminating in the Holy Eucharist. The journey begins before Mass actually starts, and if we celebrate it correctly, we will leave church better than we first came in!
