From the Principal...

UNIFORMS

We have the new proposed uniforms on display in the front office over the next two weeks. Make sure you pop in and have a look, we are very excited about them and have had quite a few positive comments already. We have reduced the number of options for both winter and summer and have tightened up certain aspects of both the boys and girls uniforms.

We have been talking as a community about making our uniforms more streamlined for about 12 months now, and after surveys and many P&C meeting discussions, what you see in the office is what will be introduced in 2015. In a few weeks we will be ordering the uniforms to sell at school. You may purchase the new uniform this year, however the current uniform will still be acceptable until the end of 2014.

A price list and further details will be provided in a few weeks when we have more information available. We understand that the new uniform will be more expensive, however the quality of the uniforms is excellent. We will be offering a range of subsidies for families who find the financial burden difficult, as well as those families who have multiple children. These details will also be discussed at a later date.

SOCCEROOS

All teachers and those students who have returned permission notes will be travelling to Homebush to watch the Socceroos on Monday night. The match will be played between Australia and South Africa and is an international match. Even though the match will be a friendly one, it is still a very important match for both teams, preparing for the upcoming Soccer World Cup.

We still have a few seats left if there are any students, or brothers, sisters, friends etc who would like to attend. See Maryce in the office for details.

Students from Cattai Public School will be taking part in a walk around the stadium before the game, to promote the Premier's Sporting Challenge. An amazing opportunity.

I will include some details below for Monday.

Depart School: approx. 3pm (students will be allowed to stay at school in the afternoon, or they can travel home and return to school before the bus departs.

Return to school: approx. 11.00pm. Facebook will be used to update families on our arrival time back at school, as this will depend on when the game ends, as well as traffic.

Dress: Students will be required to wear their full **sports** uniform while participating in the march. This includes **BLACK** shoes/runners. As the game will be played at night, it will get quite cold. Students can bring their school winter jumpers, or they can bring other jumpers / parkas to keep warm.

Food: Many students have taken the opportunity to pre-order McDonalds. We will be stopping at McDonalds on the way to the soccer, at around 4.00pm to have dinner. As students will not be returning to school until approx. 11.00pm, students may want something to eat at the game. Parents are encouraged to send a plastic bag with nibblies and an extra drink etc. If you would like to send money for students to purchase items from the food outlet, that is ok as well.

Please do not bring large bags. These will be cumbersome while we are at the match. If

students are bringing additional food, please bring this in a plastic bag, clearly marked with a name.

If you have any other questions, please ask us before Monday.

CAR PARK SAFTEY

We have had a number of parents approach us recently to express concerns over the safety of students in the school car park. In the mornings we ask that parents drop students off at the top gate and students walk down the path to the undercover area. This happens most of the time and is quite effective at keeping students away from moving vehicles.

In the afternoon, students are required to wait at the front gate until a parent has exited their vehicle and should walk students across the car park safely.

On most occasions these procedures are followed, and we thank those families. Could I just remind all families that our main priority is to keep students safe and to adhere to these rules for the safety of all students.

STATIONERY

Could I just remind all families of the importance of students bringing the correct equipment to school. We have quite a few students not bringing in the correct equipment and it can affect the outstanding teaching and learning which takes place in classrooms. Having the correct pens, pencils, rulers etc. at school ensures that students are ready to take an active role in their learning and are able to achieve their best. Thank you for your understanding.

HEADPHONES

It has been fantastic to see students using computers, iPads, iPods etc. during lessons to engage in lesson content in the classrooms. It's a sign of the times and these devices have many benefits in terms of student learning outcomes.

We are finding though that these devices can require sound to be effective and this can become quite loud in the classroom setting. We are requesting that students bring in their own set of headphones to use in the classroom. This will help keep the noise down and ensure that we continue to integrate technology effectively in the classroom.

4/5/6 CLASS WORK

Class 4/5/6 have made a wonderful start to this term. They are all working hard on their "Gold" project, learning about the early gold rush in Australia. The children are researching where and how gold was found and mined, what life on the goldfields was like, the Eureka Stockade and the impact and effects of the gold rush in Australia. Some have chosen to present their work on cardboard while others are doing a PowerPoint presentation. Everyone in the class will present a 3 minute talk about their project at the end of term.

Year 6 students have also been learning about decimals, fractions and percentages. Year 5 has begun to look at setting out a budget on a spreadsheet and Year 4 has been learning about time and various addition strategies.

We have been reading the story of "Rowan of Rin" which has everyone thinking hard trying to work out Sheba's rhymes and predicting what will happen next. The students have made some great observations regarding caring and

friendship. We are wondering what will be found at the top of the mountain, so stay tuned.
