

NEFFA Festival 2021 Goes Live Online

A year ago, this newsletter published an article about changes at NEFFA's upcoming Festival. We had a new site for the 2020 event, and the article described some of the challenges we were facing and the hopes we were harboring. Like everyone else, we had no idea what was coming. When we think of having to cancel the in-person NEFFA Festival two years in a row, "unprecedented" is the tip of the iceberg. Dance, music, crafts—creative communities of all kinds—are grieving and trying to find ways to stay connected. We are eager to be together again, and we're ready for this long, strange ordeal to end.

In April 2020, NEFFA's Program Chair, Jon Cannon, took matters in hand. In a few weeks, he gathered a respectable collection of videos from a variety of performers. It was more fun than many of us expected to learn dances, sing songs, pick up harmonica tips,

and more, all on our own computer screens. People posted wonderful comments about the videos. It was so much better than nothing.

A lot of water has flowed under the proverbial bridge since then. A lot of clever people have been working on ways folks can dance and sing and gather online. This year, we had plenty of notice that NEFFA would not be an inperson event. Jon

once again brought his creativity and energy to bear on the situation. He suggested some possible online offerings that NEFFA could take on, and assembled a new Online Program Committee. A few Board members volunteered to help, with some new faces beyond the usual Program Committee. Meetings and plotting and scheming began in the fall, and the scope of it all has grown beyond what anyone expected.

Since November, this committee has been mounting a three-hour online event one Sunday a month. Concerts, drumming, dance, open mic sessions—it's been an enticing series. A tech crew has been building to support Zoom meetings and special sound considerations for online events. Members of the committee attended a wide range of online events—concerts, singalongs, camps, festivals, parties. They've taken notes, called for advice, and shared experiences, learning all along.

As a result, the NEFFA Festival weekend, April 23-25, 2021, will bring an exciting range of offerings. Over 120 performers applied to do online livestreamed events. We will offer 8-10 tracks of live online programming on Zoom. When the Online Program Committee first put the draft of the grid for this year's Festival together, they were amazed at how much it looked like a "normal" NEFFA grid. The schedule will be posted on the website soon, and we are eager to share our excitement with you!

Many other performers will provide recordings, which will roll out on the Festival weekend. This year's video track will feature video collages and a Massive Asynchronous Jam created especially for this Festival. Video from past NEFFAs will bring the joy of people dancing, singing, and making music together in person. We'll also provide online spaces for participants to

hang out and chat. The NEFFA website will include listings of Crafts and Folk Bazaar vendors and other pieces that we hope will make attending this Online Festival feel more familiar and satisfying.

NEFFA is an amazing volunteer organization. The bonds people form as they work to put together an event like the NEFFA Festival are deeply rewarding. The skills required to

pull together an online Festival are rather different than those needed to put on an in-person event, but the committee has found it remarkable how much of the effort winds up feeling familiar. It has been an inspiration to watch a willing and capable group of people rise to the occasion.

NEFFA's mission as an organization is to encourage and preserve traditional folk arts. The deeper point of that mission is to build community, to bring people together for shared experiences and common purpose. We are heartbroken at not being able to gather in person this year, but we truly hope and believe that NEFFA's online offerings can bring people together in meaningful and enjoyable ways.

National Folk Organization Hosts Virtual Conference for 2021

There is something for everyone at this year's National Folk Organization virtual conference event!

This spring will see a conference that embraces the virtual world of folk arts, with more than 20 hours of folk arts programming that spans the globe. The conference will be free to everyone via Zoom. Registration is open, and the NFO conference webpage has been updated. This year's virtual conference will mark the first time that all NFO members will have the opportunity to attend the Annual Membership Meeting and vote for officers. The meeting will start bright and early Wednesday, April 7, as we hear annual reports on what the NFO has been working on all year. Meet the new board nominees, then vote for our incoming leaders. After a break, we'll launch into our artist presentations and finish the day with the President's Reception and dance party that evening. Presentations and dance parties continue until the end of our get-



together on Sunday evening. We hope you will be there for all of it!

There will be master teachers giving dance workshops; other experts presenting their research into folk arts; participatory folk music and crafts lessons; and CEU's available for those that can use them. Some of the people joining us will be Travel Bare Feet television presenter



Mickela Mallozzi, ethnochoreologist Dr. Catherine Foley, and dance teachers Caspar Bik, Ahmet Luleci, Maurits van Geel, Steve Kotansky, France Bourque-Moreau and Yves Moreau.

Around the world programming will take us from Turkey through Macedonia, Poland, France and Ireland. We will learn about South Appalachian flat footing, French Canadian children's dances, Pacific Northwest First Nations traditions, Polynesian singing

and Bulgarian folk dance in Japan.

Many NFO members take advantage of the insurance that we offer. This year, many will return the favor by leading a few of the dances over Zoom during our evening dance parties. Be sure to join us as we dance together while apart. More information on the website nfo-usa.org. We look forward to seeing you in April!


For as Many as Will: A Tour of English Country Dance




