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Merit Badge Pre-Requisites

*Eagle Required Merit Badge. Recommended for First Class Scouts and above with Scoutmaster's approval.

Scouts may only register for one Eagle class.

- Scouts MUST be in Class A Uniform, read their merit badge pamphlets and be prepared.
- Some classes request that scouts bring a printed copy of the merit badge worksheet (see pre-requisites below).
- Scouts with disabilities are encouraged to have an adult accompany them in class. Instructors are unable to provide 1:1 instruction in this environment.
- Siblings and non-registered youth are not allowed in the classroom.
- Field trips have limited space for transportation. If adults want to attend, please contact troop37mbu@gmail.com in advance or to volunteer to drive.
- Blue cards will be provided.
