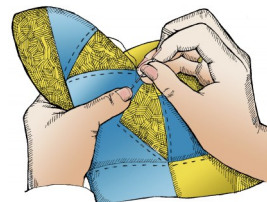

August 19, 2013

Donna Meador called the meeting to order at 6:30 and welcomed all present.

Willard Knipp led the devotional for the evening. He spoke about faith. He shared a line from the movie "42" dealing with Jackie Robinson breaking the color barrier in baseball; "I'm a Methodist, Jackie's a Methodist, God's a Methodist, this is going to work". He then shared from Matthew 14...where Peter walks on water. Willard pointed out that Peter did something that God is calling us to do; to get out of the boat. He knows after his first year here that we are not where we need to be, but he is ready to step out of the boat, and he hopes that some of us will go with him. Willard then closed in prayer.

Donna then started a time of LOVING around the room in which prayer concerns specifically for council members were shared. Requests included praise for anniversary and birthday celebrations, support and welcome of the church family, and that God has been good. Prayer requests included those for health concerns, supporting others through health or emotional issues, start of college/ classes, discernment for job prospects, recent losses, and changes in family dynamics. Jim Coots closed the time in prayer and we will continue to lift each other up.

Donna then asked that the minutes of the July 15, 2013 meeting be addressed. David Pratt made a motion that the minutes be accepted. Jim Coots seconded the motion and the minutes were approved.

Donna next asked that we address the Consent Agenda Reports. Larry Crouch made a motion that the Consent Agenda Reports be accepted without the pulled items. David Pratt seconded the motion and the Consent Agenda Reports were accepted.

Donna next had the pulled items from the Consent Agenda addressed.

Clyde Tharp spoke first for the Finance Committee. He brought a definition of "2nd Mile Funds" to clarify this prior to the fall stewardship campaign. As background, the 2nd Mile Fund was established when the church was paying down the indebtedness on the youth building. The proposed definition is that "2nd Mile Funds are those funds, beyond one's giving to the General Fund, to be utilized for debt retirement and capital improvements". Trisha Hobbs seconded this proposed definition and the council voted unanimously to affirm using this definition for the upcoming stewardship campaign.

Kenny Gardner next spoke for Serve/Congregational Care. Kenny shared an update on the van fundraiser. The luncheon is this Sunday and they are hoping for a good turnout. Paul Erway will be here for the luncheon to talk about modified vans. Volunteers are still needed for the fundraising committee.

Donna Meador next spoke for Serve/Congregational Care about a request from Erin Reid and her mom. Erin was diagnosed with MS several years ago and is pursuing stem cell therapy in California. This is not yet FDA approved so it is not covered by Medicare/ Medicaid. They are requesting any help we can offer and have a goal of raising \$ 9,000 to cover the therapy and transportation. Kenny Gardner stated that the Needs-Based Ministry Fund only has \$ 186 in the account. Larry Crouch mentioned to Kenny that he may want to ask the Sunday School classes to help build up the fund. Kenny made a motion to consolidate the Pastor's Fund with the Needs-Based Ministry Fund to be administered by the pastor to help both members and those who come to the church seeking assistance. Larry Crouch seconded the motion and after a brief discussion the motion was voted on and approved. Donald Durden stated that he would write a check to the Pastor's Fund for the balance of the Needs-Based Ministry Fund. Donna Meador turned the meeting back to the request from Erin Reid. After discussion by the council it was decided that Donna Meador will come up with a

Fundraiser to support Erin.

Larry Crouch spoke next from Send/Missions. Larry stated that Lori Greulich wants to step down as leader of Kids Korner. After taking June and July off, we held Kids Korner on August 17th and had 5-6 kids present. We are also down two volunteers at present. The team is looking for new leadership or a new direction for the Kids Korner outreach ministry. Donna Meador suggests that we advertise for a person called to lead. Matt Bell shared an observation from his first several months here concerning the number of different leaders for the program. He thinks it is still a vital outreach. Willard Knipp added that this leadership position is something we want to recruit to fill, rather than to make a plea from the pulpit for a volunteer. Donna Meador stated that she will get with the Lay Leadership team on this.

Larry Crouch next spoke on Impact Kentucky. To be held on August 24th, we have about twelve (12) church members, including three youth, going that day to work on four projects to help senior handicapped people.

Donna Meador next asked Donald Durden to present the Finance Report. Donald had provided copies of his six-page report. He stated that we are not far off from where we planned to be.

Donna next asked Willard Knipp for his Pastor's Report. Willard stated that he has completed his Safe Sanctuary training which included boundaries training on social networking. As the world changes, we need to adapt. The Thursday visits with Membership Care have been great and he has enjoyed the insights from the other members. Willard recommends the book *Renovate or Die* by Bob Farr as well as the book *Back to Zero* that the parish leaders of Franklin and Shelby counties have completed. He had the opportunity to preach at a unity service at Redbird Mission before back to school. The Charge Conference will be held on November 24th and will be county-wide. Dr. Hawxhurst will be conducting the conference which will have a time of worship, a potluck dinner, and breakout groups for approval votes. Grafenburg U.M.C. can not be there that evening. We are trying to get the Redbird Mission craft fair to stay after the morning worship services for the conference. Willard next expressed deep concerns about where we are headed. Sometimes God calls his people to new adventures to break them out of the lethargy of what has gone before. We are on the cusp of something and he knows that we're hurting but he asks that we have some faith that God isn't done with us. Willard had a handout with a proposal. Willard is requesting that Donna Meador appoint a committee to meet over the next month to work with Pastor Willard to review the administrative structure with a goal of possibly streamlining the approach while maintaining adherence to The Book of Discipline of The United Methodist Church. Currently the same people are discussing the same issue three times in Finance, Trustees, and SPR meetings prior to bringing the item to the Church Council. This committee will explore finding a better way to use our time. After some discussion by the council it was decided that Donna Meador will appoint an exploratory committee to bring a recommendation to the Church Council.

Donna next asked if there was anything to report from Lay Leadership/Delegate. Larry Crouch did not have an update.

Donna asked if there was any other business to discuss. There was none.

Donna stated that the next meeting date is set for September 16th.

Willard Knipp then closed the meeting in prayer and Donna Meador adjourned the meeting at 7:44 p.m.

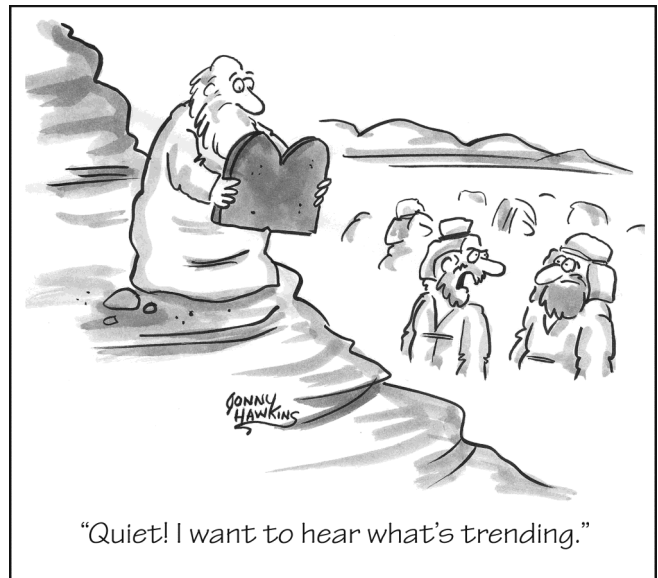


REFORMATION

Pillars of Faith...

Because Martin Luther nailed his 95 theses, or thoughts, to a church door in Wittenberg, Germany, on October 31, 1517, many Christians remember that day and the major changes, or Reformation, that resulted. Luther's theses contained three main pillars, which have stood for almost 500 years:

1. **Sola Scriptura (Scripture Alone)** The Bible is the sole authority in matters of faith, life and conduct. "All scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness."
(2 Timothy 3: 16)
2. **Sola Fide (Faith Alone)** Christians are justified, or declared righteous, only through believing in Jesus Christ as Savior. Although morality and good works are important, they alone cannot lead to salvation. "A person is justified not by the works of the law but through faith in Jesus Christ." (Galatians 2:16)
3. **Sola Gratia (Grace Alone)** Grace is God's unmerited, or undeserved, favor. Salvation is a free gift from our gracious God. "For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God—not the result of works, so that no one may boast." (Ephesians 2: 8—9)
