**From the North:** Take I-41 south to Bluemound Road exit (39). Left on Bluemound Road to 95th Street (first intersection past freeway ramps). Left on 95th to Wisconsin Avenue. Right on Wisconsin Avenue to Center for Arts and Performance and Parking Center on the right.

**From the South:** Take I-894 north to Bluemound Road exit. Right on Bluemound Road to 90th Street. Left on 90th to Wisconsin Avenue. Right on Wisconsin Avenue to Center for Arts and Performance and Parking Center on the right.

**From the East:** Take I-94 west to 84th Street exit (306). Right on 84th Street to Wisconsin Avenue. Left on Wisconsin Avenue to Parking Center and Center for Arts and Performance on the left.

**From the West:** Take I-94 east to 84th Street exit (306). Left on 84th Street to Wisconsin Avenue. Left on Wisconsin Avenue to Center for Arts and Performance and Parking Center on the left.

# **AH, WILDERNESS!**

#### By Eugene O'Neill Directed by Professor Jay Sierszyn

Written in 1933 and sub-titled A Comedy of *Recollection*, this play is a nostalgic (and idealized) trip back to a simpler, more innocent

time: 1906. Seventeen-year-old Richard Miller has just graduated from high school, and his mind is filled with exhilarating thoughts from his recent readings of the "scandalous" Europeans. He is presently so overcome with poetry that nearly everything he proclaims is in verse! The action takes place on the Fourth of July, and Richard and his family all have various plans to celebrate the day. *Ah Wilderness!* has been called a "conventional comedy of manners," and yet O'Neill fully explores the many forms of love and in the end displays the depth of family love.

# ELEVEN STATIONS OF SHAKESPEARE

#### Adapted and directed by Professor Simon Provan

Inspired by and based on *Station Eleven*, the 2022-2023 WLC "campus read" selection, this

production will feature 11 scenes from the works of William Shakespeare set in a post-apocalyptic time. A mixture of scenes that are either directly mentioned or at least alluded to in the campus read, this production will be intentional in creating a story-arc to which all audience members can relate on some level.

# QUILTERS

#### Book by Molly Newman and Barbara Damashek Music and lyrics by Barbara Damashek Directed by Professor Jay Sierszyn

*Quilters* is a musical patchwork of stories and songs that centers on the challenges, hardships, triumphs, and joys of the American pioneer family. The show focuses primarily on the

experiences of girls and women striving to find and express their identity, establish and hold together the family, and weather the frequent storms. Ultimately, *Quilters* is a celebration of shared blessings – large and small – and the need to pass these blessings and stories (the "quilts" of our lives) from one generation to the next.



## WAYS TO PURCHASE TICKETS

- **Online:** Purchase your tickets anytime, 24 hours a day, at wlc.edu/arts. You will have the option to choose your seats.
- **Phone:** Purchase your tickets by calling the Box Office at 414.443.8802. Tickets will be mailed unless they are purchased within one week of the performance, in which case they will be held on will-call.
- In Person: Purchase your tickets in person at the Box Office located inside the main entrance at 8815 West Wisconsin Avenue. You will receive your tickets immediately.

All ticket prices include sales tax.

# FEES

A \$5 per order transaction fee applies to all Box Office window sales, phone sales, and online sales for willcall and mailed orders. Tickets purchased online with electronic delivery will not incur any additional ticket fees. An additional \$2 per order shipping fee applies to all mailed orders. All ticket prices include sales tax.

# TICKET INSURANCE

Consider purchasing Ticket Insurance to cover your ticket purchase. Ticket Insurance can be purchased for **\$2 per ticket** at the time of purchase. Ticket Insurance enables you to return or exchange tickets for an event up to 48 hours prior to the performance start time. Without Ticket Insurance, all sales are final, and there are no refunds or exchanges allowed. Without Ticket Insurance, tickets may be donated as a tax deductible contribution 48 hours in advance of the performance start time.

The Box Office opens one hour prior to all ticketed events.

# Ticketing & House Policies

## TICKETING POLICIES

- No refunds or exchanges are allowed on ticket purchases without Ticket Insurance unless a performance is canceled or rescheduled.
- Any refunds given with Ticket Insurance will be issued in the form of credit back to the card used to purchase the tickets. If the original payment was cash or check, a check will be mailed to the ticket purchaser within 10-12 business days of the refund transaction.
- Ticket orders are not accepted without full payment of cash, check, or credit card at the time of purchase. Tickets may not be reserved or held for payment at a later date.
- Unused tickets can be returned for a tax-deductible donation up to 48 hours prior to a performance.
- Patrons will receive the best seats available and will not have the ability to choose their seats when purchasing tickets within one hour before performances.
- Students may purchase rush tickets to any event for \$3.00 one hour prior to the event if tickets are available. Students must present a current student ID card at the Box Office when purchasing tickets.
- Students may call the Box Office on the day of the event to check on the likely availability of Student Rush Tickets.

# HOUSE POLICIES

- Reserved seating selection is not guaranteed for those who arrive after a performance begins.
- Latecomers will be seated at a suitable pause in the performance.
- Wisconsin Lutheran College will follow CDC guidelines regarding current health and safety protocols. Please follow signage located in the Center for Arts and Performance when you attend an event.
