I am hoping for a sunny June. As I write this in May, it seems that our spring was brief, and is over, and we've skipped straight to Fall. This is how I know: I have a small Japanese maple tree in a pot. Earlier this month, we moved our houseplants, including this one, outside to the patio—out of potential frost zones, but also out of the house. It's a yearly ritual, this moving-out. It signals spring to me, and probably to the plants, as well. I want them to embrace the sunlight and fresh air as I do when Spring finally rises.



Panel: Climate Crisis: Through the Eyes of Those that Didn't Make It, But Are Tasked with Unmaking It.

Binghamton University student climate activists and Susquehanna Sierra Group members will engage on the Climate Crisis. The students recently conducted a series of Climate Crisis teach-ins motivated by the UN's recent Climate report which stated that we have only 11 years to change society to be sustainable and regenerative instead of exploitative. They state: "We are the first generation that will feel the impacts of Climate Change and the last generation that can do anything about it. This crisis is not of our making but it must be of our un-making. This un-making begins with un-telling. We must tirelessly challenge all the stories that have driven us into this crisis."

We welcome the BU students who are engaging themselves in tackling the Climate Crisis and all the impacts they face. Most of us older adults will not see the worst, but the younger people will. They've asked us to share our ideas as well as explain how the Sierra Club is addressing them.

Important topics covered in the workshops:

- 1. Ever Upward: Environmental Justice in Broome County
- 2. Beyond Sustainability: Regenerative Agriculture
- 3. Divestment Campaign, and its Relation to Campus Reform


