President's message

You might be wondering what I am doing here writing the President's message. Last month, the membership received notice of a special board meeting to consider suspending a provision of the Temple bylaws to allow our Treasurer, Steve Abrams, be a candidate for Temple president. That motion required a 2/3 vote of the board, and while it



received a majority vote, it did not receive the required 2/3 vote to pass. About the same time as this motion was pending, Temple President Mark Greenfield decided not to serve a second year. I was nominated for President at the annual membership meeting and agreed to serve.

We read in Deuteronomy 27:6, "Thou shalt build the altar of the Lord thy God of unhewn stones." Unhewn stones, as the term implies, are different shapes and sizes, and sometimes have sharp edges. They are, however, authentic, distinctive, and genuine. If you look at the new officers and directors of Temple Beth Emet you will see that there are long standing members of the congregation and newer members. There are many who have served on the Board for years and there are those new to the Board. There are people who are rather quiet and those who speak their mind frankly.

Each of these un-hewn stones brings something different to the Temple leadership team in perspective, talent, resources, and personality. Accepting the unique contribution of each person, rather than demanding conformity and acquiescence to a single point of view is the challenge. In fact, we are warned in Deuteronomy 27:5, "thou shalt lift up no iron tool upon them." Therefore we will fit these un-hewn stones together for one goal – to build a strong Temple community.

Periodically, Vicki and Neil would express their dismay at the way the school was run, Rabbi Kramer was not the Educational Director then, but another Rabbi, who has since passed on. They would ask me about my experiences in the Hebrew teaching biz as well as my public school background. I never understood why until Rabbi Kramer called me in April of 1986 and asked if I was interested in becoming the Educational Director of Temple Beth Emet. I said emphatically "Yes" and Rabbi told me to be patient and he would get back to me.

Because of illness in the family, I hadn't tutored Philip for several weeks. At the next tutoring session, after my lesson was finished, Vicki said she wanted to ask me something. She said, "Would you be interested in being the Educational Director of Temple Beth Emet? I said, "Yes, I told Rabbi the same thing." She said, "Oh darn, we wanted to be the ones to ask and tell the board your answer. We are so pleased !!!" I thought, "Me too."

That was over 23 years ago and my first impression of Vicki and Neil and their love of Temple has not changed. I have worked with Neil on many projects, some are public knowledge and some are not. Vicki always has her pulse on what's happening at Temple and calls me when she needs to tell me about a congregant who is in need. One of Neil's non-public efforts for the Temple and for me comes to mind immediately. When Rabbi Kramer left in February of 1996, he accused me of betraying our friendship for doing what I felt was best for the Temple. Neil acted as intermediary between us over the course of several weeks and Rabbi did my installation in June. Rabbi's absence from that event would have been a disaster for me and for the Temple.

As I said before, good friends sometimes agree and sometimes don't, but it is still a treat to sit across from the Margolins at a table and help them argue with people whose minds have led them to forget decency and morality and the needs of the common man.

We all look forward to Jennifer's wedding. The Temple knows that if you both put half the effort into Jennifer's wedding that you put into your activities for Adult Education, Temple Enrichment, the Harvest Ball, the 50th Anniversary Dinner Dance and all the other activities for Temple Beth Emet done behind the scenes, it will be a wedding for the ages. Mazel Tov, Vicki and Neil.

One last request is, as you both have done so often in the past, to please continue to act on behalf of the Temple for you both know what your absence would mean to us and how much more there is when you are present.

I Just Have to Outrun You

During a camping trip, Sam and Tom saw a bear coming their way. Sam started to take off his backpack and told Tom he was going to run for it. When his surprised friend said, "You can't outrun a bear," Sam replied, "I don't have to outrun the bear. I just have to outrun you." Sadly, this look-out-for-numberone mentality is common in business, politics, and sports. Everywhere, basically good people engage in — and justify — selfish, short-sighted conduct that treats coworkers, colleagues, and teammates as competitors rather than comrades.

Steven Carr Reuben, author of *Children of Character*, speaks about a very different social vision where people find greater mean-

ing and satisfaction in their lives by creating caring communities. To make his point, he tells of nine youngsters in the Special Olympics who were about to run the 100-yard dash.

Right after the start of the race, a young boy stumbled badly and began crying. The other eight heard him and looked back. First one, then another, then all of them stopped and went back to help their fallen comrade. A girl with Down Syndrome bent down, kissed the boy, and said, "This will make it better." Then all nine linked arms and triumphantly walked together to the finish line.

"That's what being part of a community is about," Reuben wrote. It's a lot better way to live than trying to outrun each other.

"Let me win. But if I cannot win, let me be brave in the attempt."

We learned a lot of stuff, like the travels of the Jewish people and what they went through. We learned


about Passover, Purim, Hanukkah and many other holidays and events that took place.


