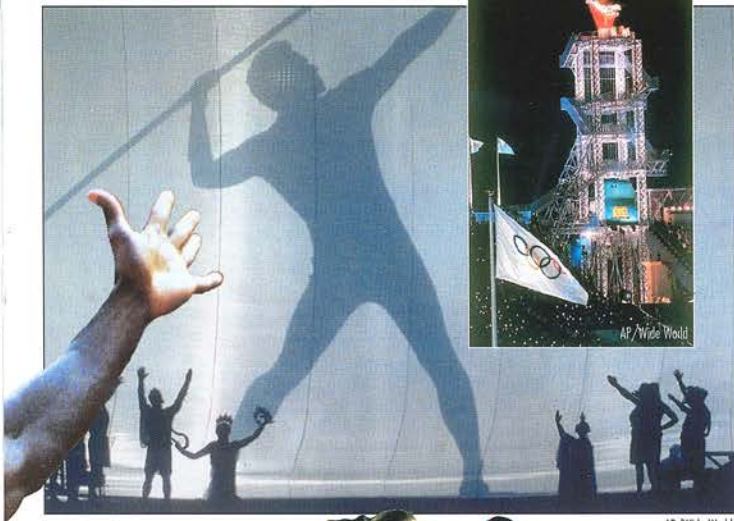
## DaZZling Double

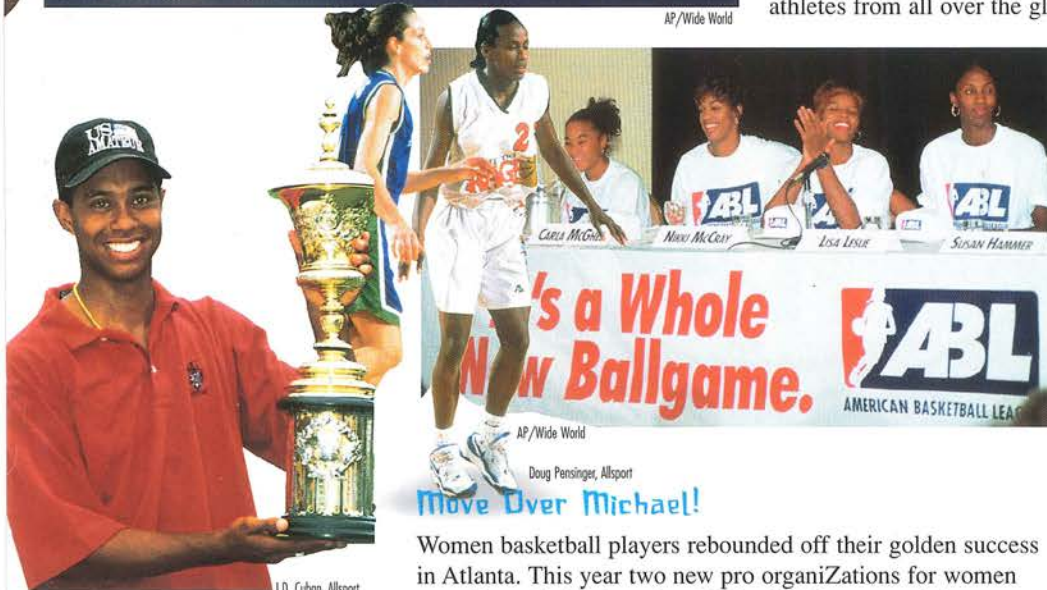

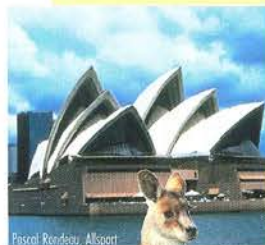

## Everything but X-Ray Vision

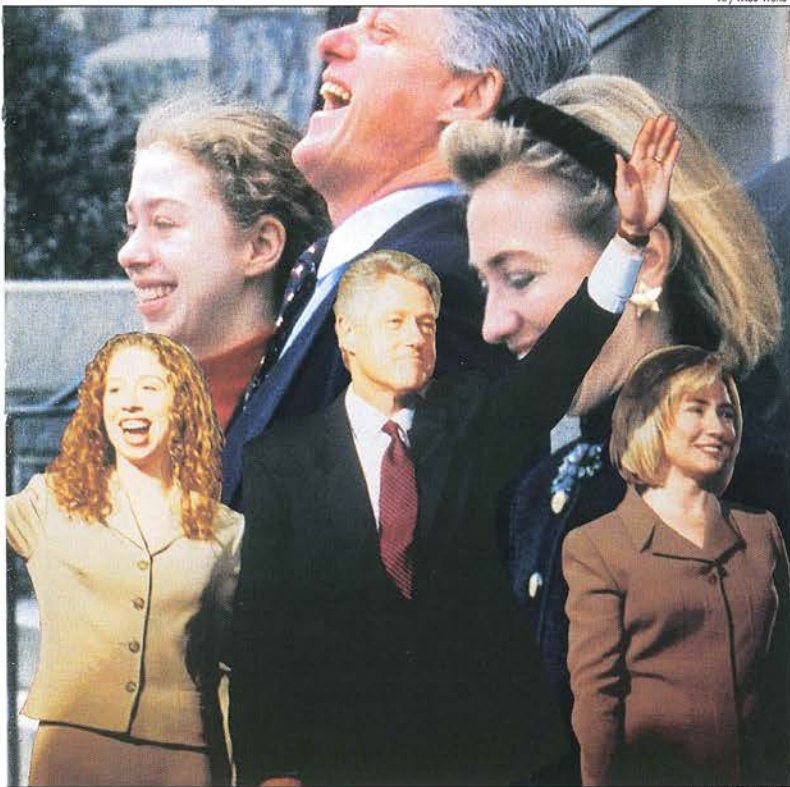
