- Better pay





• President McKinley dies 6 months in office and TR

 Term used to define Roosevelt's progressive government programs


Trustbusting

- Roosevelt and his administration filed 44 lawsuits against trusts while he was president







Relative Share of World Manufacturing






Age of Invention/Entrepreneur (late 1800s-early 1900s)

invented light bulb, motion pictures, & phonograph



1902 Coal Strike


- Workers wanted 9 hour day, 20% raise, right to unionize









The Changing American Labor Force








