MEMBERSHIP OFFICER



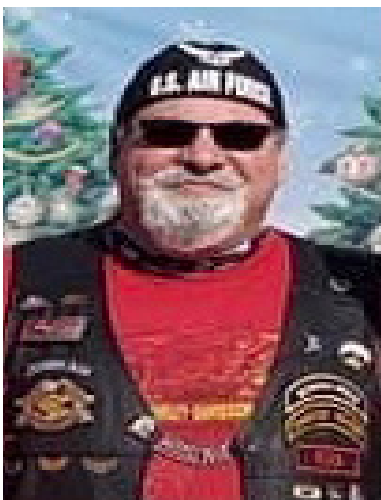
